Starling is new in the DC game and I'm really digging her character so far. This is the first volumes you will find her in, she was created by writer Duane Swierczynski. I find her fascinating in both design and unfolding characteristics, such as her apparent religious views. I am curious to see how those views will play out as this story unfolds. Poison Ivy, well, let's just say she is my favorite DC character that has ever existed. So I may be a bit biased when it comes to her, though I am not loving the New 52 bodysuit. I truly hope that they will build onto her character more in this story because she felt a bit flat. Black Canary, another favorite character of mine. I think Swierczynski has done a good job with her character but has left some unanswered questions, which hopefully have been addressed in subsequent volumes. Then add in Batgirl. BAM. Great team!
