As the cultural festival begins to get closer, Touko wants to revive the play that the council has not run for 7 years. While there are mixed reactions, Yuu wonders why she is pushing so hard to get this done. But as the two work together, Yuu does some looking into the past and discovers something about Touko that no one else seems to know. But as one girl's heart begins to wonder if she can love the other, the other wonders if she should ever love at all. This one had a few surprises, especially towards the end. A solid story with good characters and

development, from her friend who is trying to be a writer to the jealousy of another person this will go. The end is where it really begins to show the depth of a certain character. The first was a slow-burn yuri romance with really cute art and adorable characters, but because of the pacing, it was hard to tell if Yuu was really a romantic asexual, or if, as seemed far more likely, she was simply slow to awaken to truly loving her friend. But now that this volume has come out, even though the word isn't used, it's clear that she doesn't feel the sexual attraction that society has led her to expect even as her love for and relationship with Touko grow deeper. The author still could pull the rug out on this, but this volume also introduces a boy who, after only the faintest of faking towards a love triangle, is interested in hearing about and encouraging romance for other people, without having one for himself, which makes me far more confident that it is all intentional. (Now, there's a childhood friend who might provide a triangle from another direction, but... :) This is a very compassionate and accepting story as well; Yuu feels conflicted about her feelings, and wishes she could 'fall in love' with Touko to return her affection, but Touko never pressures her about it, or makes any sign that there's anything wrong with the way her girlfriend feels. She does ask for, and receives kisses in a very cute scene, though. The whole book is really very cute, actually. We get to learn more about the other characters too, and their friendships, and I love seeing all of them happy together.
