This is a quick collection of the origin stories for the four main protagonists of the original Borderlands: Roland, Lilith, Mordecai, and Brick. My problem with this is its stupidly fast pacing, usually just having things happen, and then "It's over!" Mordecai's was the only one that fully convinced me didn't need more, while Lilith's was just "Hi, I'm Lilith... Backstory... on a bus now." without anything really happening. On the other hand, I felt Roland and Brick needed at least another chapter to properly wrap up their parts. Art is good, but things move by so quickly, and the humor that Borderlands is so well known for is barely present, with maybe two chuckle-worthy moments in the entire book, that I can't really recommend this to anyone OTHER than a hardcore Borderlands fan. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
