The good part's are that it continues the story from season eight while moving the characters in new directions. As has always been a part of the Buffyverse is that the characters are always growing up, evolving, and trying to find their place in the world. This theme is what Joss Whedon excels at, and he does not disappoint here. This is not like too many other comic books where the characters seem static in time and not much ever changes. Moving Buffy to a big city opens up the possibilities for new characters to enter into her story, and a few are introduced here. Without giving too much away, I have to wonder if the main villain is the one that is hinted at near the end of the book, or if it is like last season where more people kept showing up? Either way I am stoked for the showdown that has to take place. The villain is a great character, and it is an interesting way of demonstrating the consequences of one's actions, as Buffy learns. My only gripe is that there is not a lot of involvement of the Scooby gang. I know that they are also growing up, and starting to live their own lives also, but it would be nice to see them all together solving a demon mystery. Maybe that will happen in future volumes. Overall book one starts season nine off on solid ground, and the ending will leave any reader wanting to pick up volume two and see what happens next.
