I guess at the admission that Im a huge Cap A fan, hes probably my favorite, so I dont like what theyve done to/ with him in recent years. Dudes a class A villain now? No way! But back to this trade with Sam (The Falcon) Wilson having taken on the mantle of Cap. I dont have a problem with it, or do I? Fact is as I read through this trade there were a lot of people in the storyline who were basically saying that Wilson was NOT MY CAP! and I completely felt where they were coming from (the local, street level peopleI didnt feel the same about the conniving bigwig corporate fatcats who were actively trying to take Wilson down). Sam Wilsons Captain America IS a black man with a black identity and hes not shying away from it. I felt it, and this did a great job of providing that perspective (at least this white guy thinks so). But it also shows how Wilsons Cap A is much smaller than Steve Rogers Cap A. Rogers fought for everyone; so does Wilson, but Wilsons character is also being played out more as what some would call a social justice warrior. It does not help his cause that he is constantly trying to do the right thing but the media cant capture the finer elements of his behavior and so what people see is what perhaps theyre already inclined to see through virtue of their bias. So I found this particular trade (the first that Ive read as Wilson being Cap) as challenging, and thought provoking. Not bad for a comic. As far as the Civil War II aspect of this cross-over, theres hardly anything to it which ends up being surprising because even as Falcon can fly high, he ends up feeling fairly grounded regarding the event in these pages.

In the wake of the Standoff , Steve Rogers is reinvigorated and back in the red, white and blue. Sam Wilson still wields the shield, but must once again struggle to find his place in the country he seeks to represent. Can the United States handle two Captain Americas?
