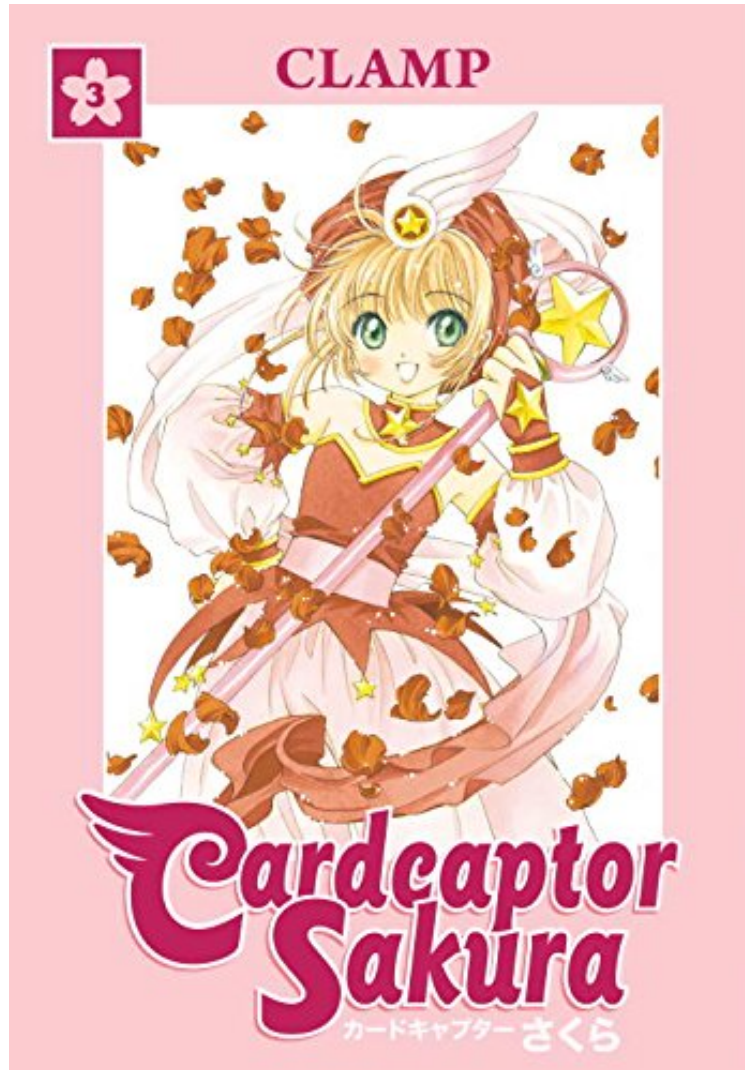

By Rebeccables*EDIT* The second edition of Book 3 has now come out. I bought it in-store and am now very happy that all four spines now match in my bookshelf. Buy away! They should be updated on by now, too. I'm of course, a little disappointed that I had to buy #3 twice, but what can you do?
Original Review:I ordered all the CCS Omnibuses together and have one small complaint about this one. The spine for my Omnibus #1, #2, and #4 are a certain design, but the spine for #3 is slightly different! This causes an awkward visual when these are put in my bookshelf. After a bit of research, I found out that Dark Horse changed their spine design between the printing of #3 and #4, and that #1 and #2 were updated once their second editions came out. #3, however, has apparently yet to be published with an updated matching spine design, because wherever I look, it has the old version, so I recommend waiting until the 2nd edition of #3 comes out before ordering this one, so you can have a nice matching set in your bookshelf :)

This made some of the smaller text hard to read and required zooming. A thing that was not needed at all in the first omnibus which used the full screen.
