why New Yorkers especially don't hate superheroes and supervillains alike. I mean even if you did stop Dr. Octopus, you're still the a-hole who threw my car at him. Behind Ms. Marvel's direction, they decide to become more socially conscious, taking on racism, human trafficking, etc. The book is drawn by Humberto Ramos. I know his art is polarizing but I personally love it. The Good: This is an excellent idea for a series. I'm surprised no one's come up with it before. I love the humor and heart that proliferates the book. I would like to see Waid develop some longer stories. So far the stories haven't lasted more than an issue and a half. The Bad: I don't care for how Hulk is portrayed as a bro. He's supposed to be the 8th smartest person in the world, not a dumb jock. The Ugly: Champions was a dumb name for a team in the 80's and it's still a dumb name today. 6 of 9 people found the following review helpful. What happened? By James B. I like Mark Waid as a writer. His Daredevil run is great, he's the first Deadpool writer I liked, and his Superman Birthright is hands down the best story for that character that has ever been written. But on this book of teenage Marvel characters, Waid has completely bombed. Champions brings together Spider man (Miles Morales), Nova, Cyclops (teenage version), Ms. Marvel, Viv Vision, and the Hulk (Amadeus Cho). After the events Civil War II, Kamala and the others become sick of the Avengers and tries to start her own team. Premise wise the story throws intelligence out the window almost immediately. Kamala quits saying she wants to do more to help people, yet the rest of the Avengers give perfectly logical reasons why they can't actually rebuild buildings. But that's a low blow, so let's discuss the real problems with this series: characters and dialogue. I don't read a lot of Ms. Marvel, but I've read enough to know she's a person who loves fun and putting on a positive attitude. Kamala in this comic is dead serious despite complaining about being typecast as the group downer. I have read Tom King's Vision (AS EVERYONE SHOULD) and his take on Viv is completely off the mark as well, lacking all the emotion she had even at the end of that story. Cho-Hulk I have never read at all, but he's an obnoxious twit regardless. Miles, Nova, and Cyclops are mostly just there. As for dialogue, this series tries to cram in every #teen issue it possibly could with no subtle or even purpose. The plot lines honestly got worse as the series went on, culminating in the Champions vs. right wing southern sheriff stirring up hate crimes. My god, was that painful. After Cringily discussing hate directed at every group imaginable, the Champions ultimately can't do anything about the situation. One kind of nihilistic message is that? And that's not even getting into the abomination that was Waid's Gwenpool. Buy something else.
