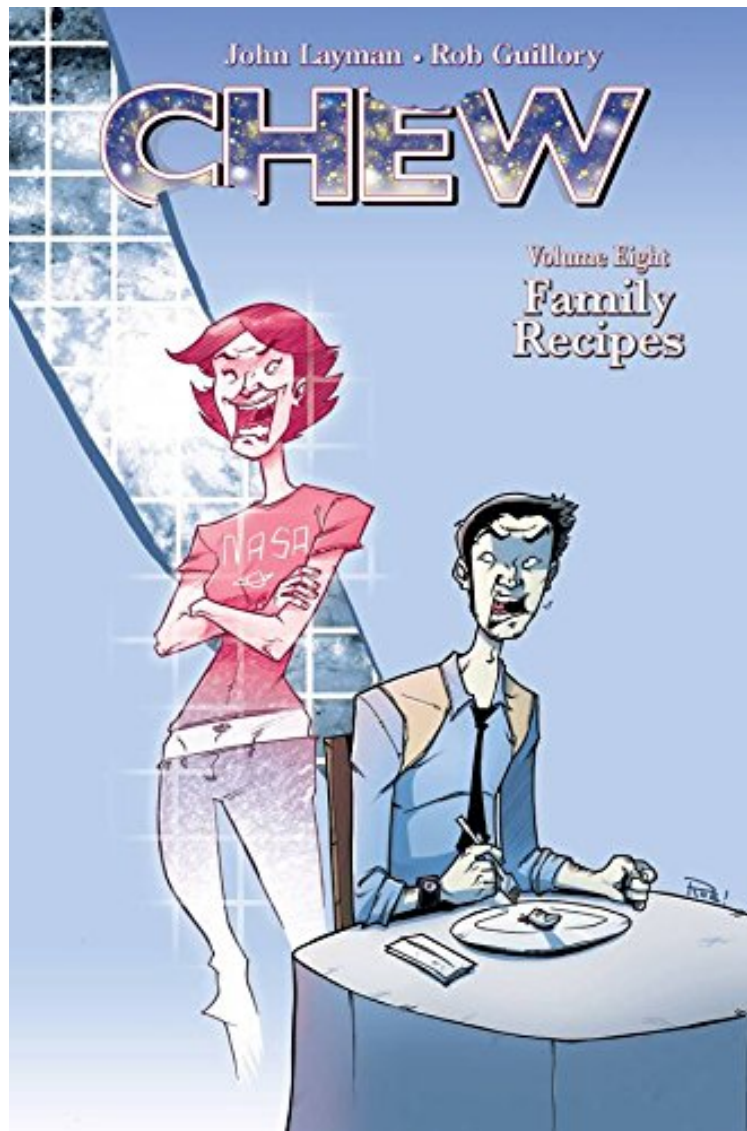

Layman and Guillory are a great team - they've been together for every issue of this series. The writing is original, funny, surprising and at times, touching. Tony is a Cibopath (he gets "psychic sensations of the past of anything he bites or ingests"). He uses his powers to solve cases for the FDA. Throughout the series, he solves a number of smaller

cases while working on the over-arching case of the series. It has deservedly won Eisner and Harvey awards. Tony's sister reappears (but not in the typical way that the Big Two brings back dead characters) and it's both humorous and poignant. Tony's daughter takes on a stronger role in this collection, and we also learn a bit more about the Chu family's past.
