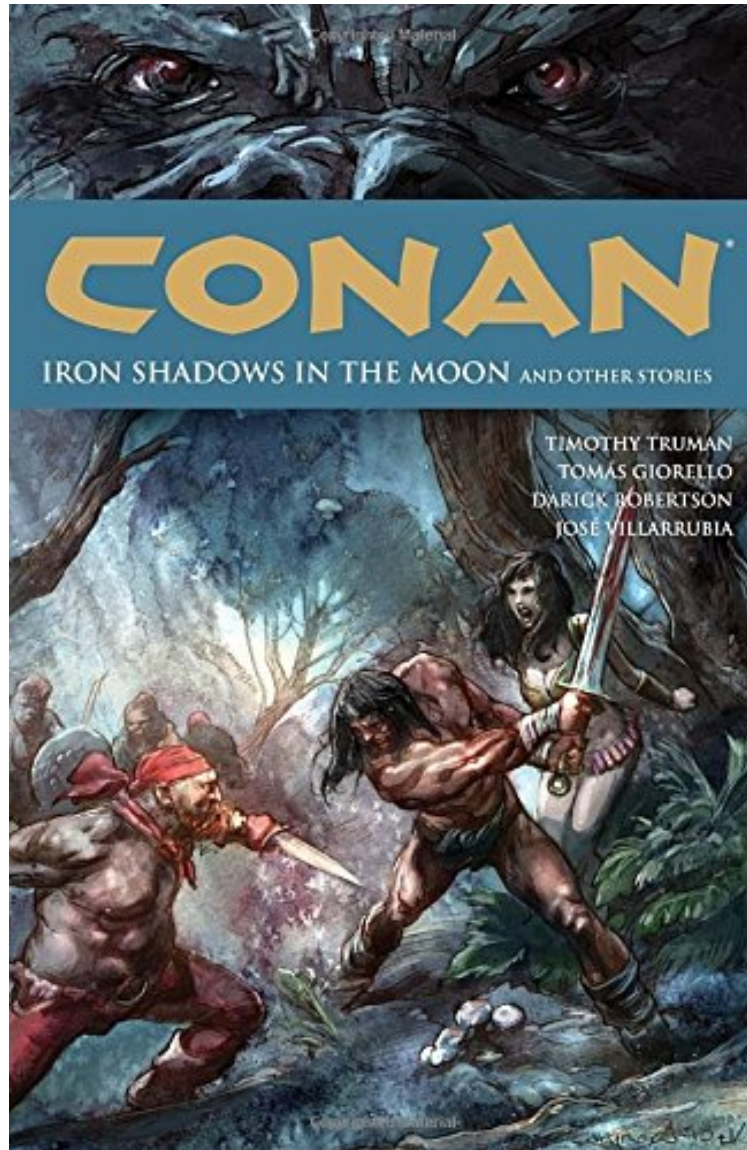

I like the artwork in the early volumes better than in the later (as seems to be the consensus as well). However, I still enjoyed this one overall. The story wasn't that great and seemed somewhat short to me. I actually enjoyed the two "bonus" stories in the second half of the book better than the main Iron Shadows one. The artwork in the bonus stories is radically different and yet has its own appeal, with good color and light/shadows contrast. I've been reading Conan for more than 30 years and the author and illustrator really capture the story nearly as good as Robert E Howard did when he wrote it. I recommend this one for Conan fans.

On the run from the army of Turan, Conan and fellow fugitive Olivia hide out on a small island in the Vilayet Sea. They soon find themselves stalked by an unseen terror in the jungles and threatened by a group of pirates belonging to the Red Brotherhood, which is led by Conan's sworn enemy - Sergius of Koth! However, those may be the least of Conan's concerns, because when the moon rises on this island, the ruins of a lost civilization stir and an ancient, deadly curse awakens!
