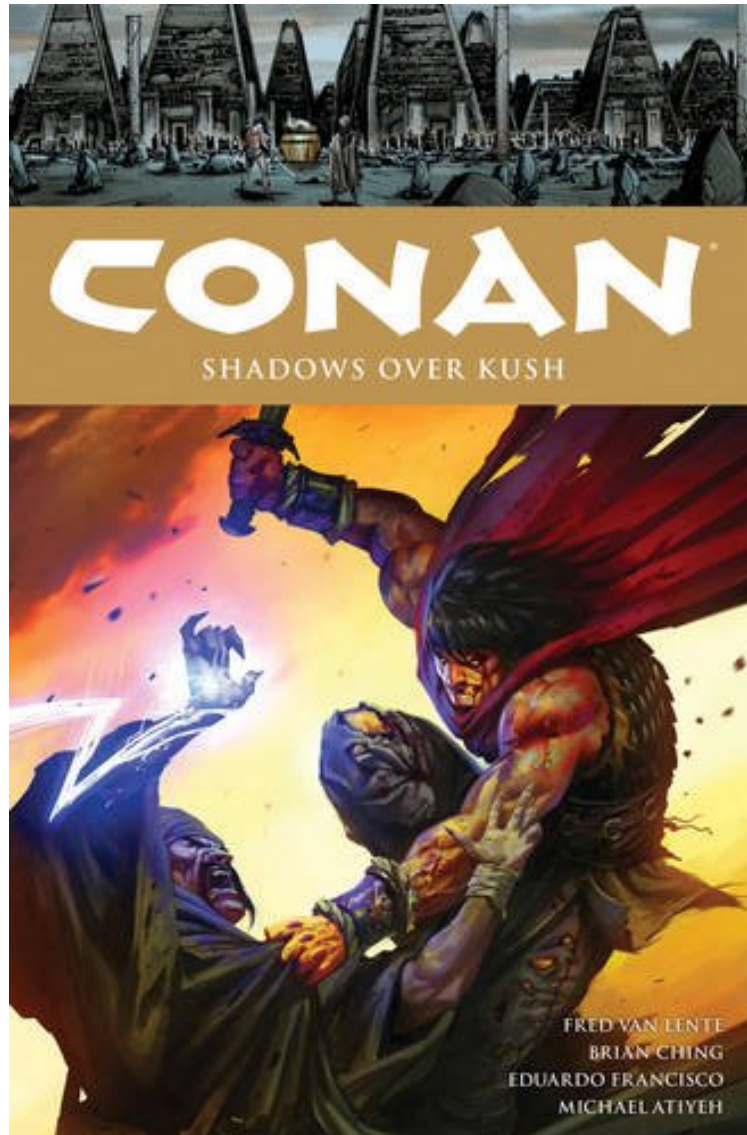

This book feels more like a return to the later Truman stuff when he was still on the main Conan title. I wasn't crazy about the creature in this book but the fact that it was merely a fragment left behind by Howard meant there had to be even more interpretation than on the fully completed stories. I wouldn't necessarily recommend this book but I certainly have nothing bad to say about it, just sort of a run of the mill Conan story to me.
