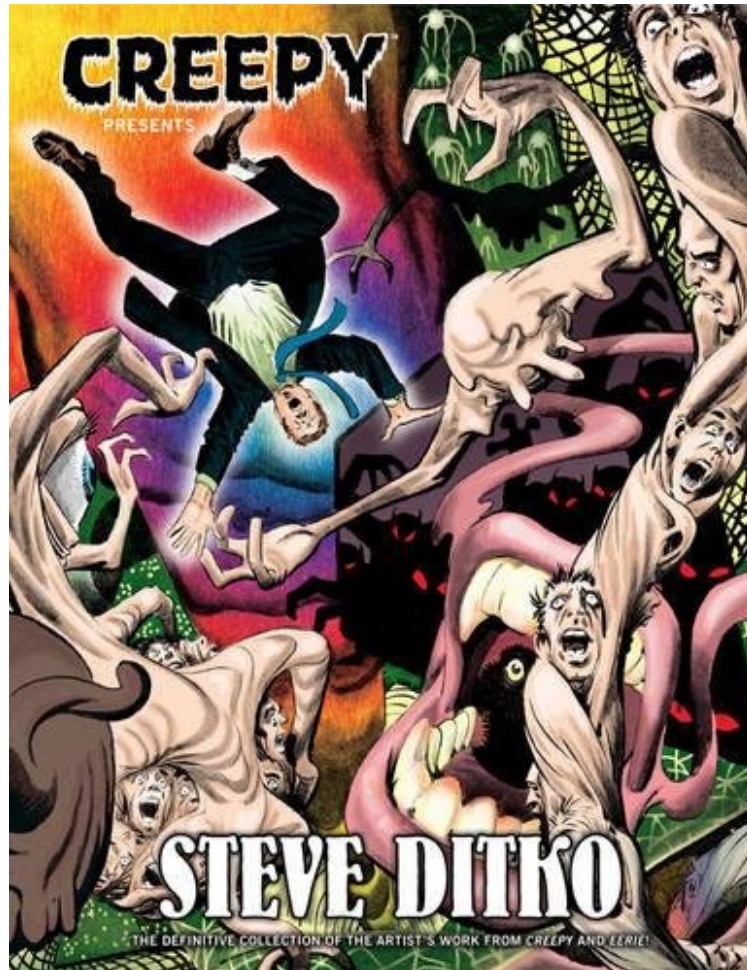

But this black and white, magnificently illustrated collection, in watercolour and innovative tonal drawing, is a real Steve Ditko high-point. I'm very picky when it comes to non-Spiderman or non-Dr Strange Ditko, and this is a real apex, superb set of stories. Petrush Jr. The Ditko stories were, to me, among the highlights of the early, Archie Goodwin-era Warren zines, along with the Torres, Crandall, and Colan stories. The reproduction in this volume is even better than in the originals. I won't give it 5 stars because, let's be honest--Ditko was, and always has been, of inconsistent quality. Also, some of the writing falls a little short in the punch-ending aspect. But overall, I recommend this highly. Lovers of Dr. Strange will enjoy Ditko's mystic dimensions rendered in black and white.
