The middle story 'The Livers' felt like the weakest out of the three. It's a continuation of the Amanda story arc from Crossed: Psychopath and doesn't really pop. Maybe it's because it tries to mix personal insanity with the general Crossed insanity and comes off kind of bland instead of sharp and hard

hitting. Hopefully any future Crossed stories with the Amanda character will balance better. The Garth Ennis story which is the beginning, 'The Fatal Englishman' was good, if kind of preachy at times. Ennis still delivers and I own other comics he's done, so the man puts in work.
