It carries the same tone, as Matt Murdock's life is continually torn apart by his enemies now that his identity is more or less publicly known. It's difficult to praise the highlights of this book without giving too much away, as Daredevil seems to have gotten his life back upon getting out of prison in the previous volume, only to see things start to crumble again here. I will say I have enjoyed seeing Gladiator as a conflicted, reluctant villain ever since Frank Miller redefined the character back in the late '70s and early '80s, and it's great to see Burbaker use him in a similar manner here.
