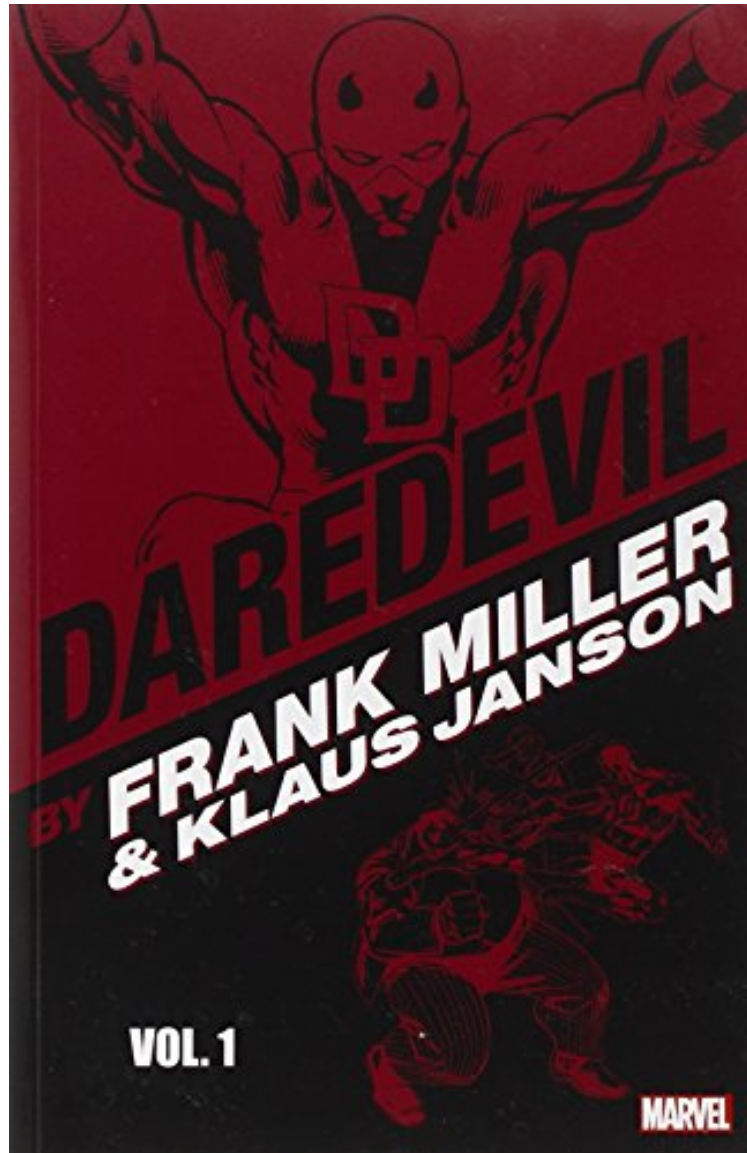

mediocre Peter Parker the Spec Spider-Man. It's staggering, though, to see the art instantly change when he jumps into the main Daredevil title and has his pencils inked by Klaus Janson. Really makes you appreciate Janson's contribution. Storywise, most of the comics here are not written by Miller. They're also not as good as the stories in volumes 2 and 3. However, this is worth getting for the first appearance of Elektra and a terrific story against Gladiator, who becomes a lot more important during Bendis' run.
