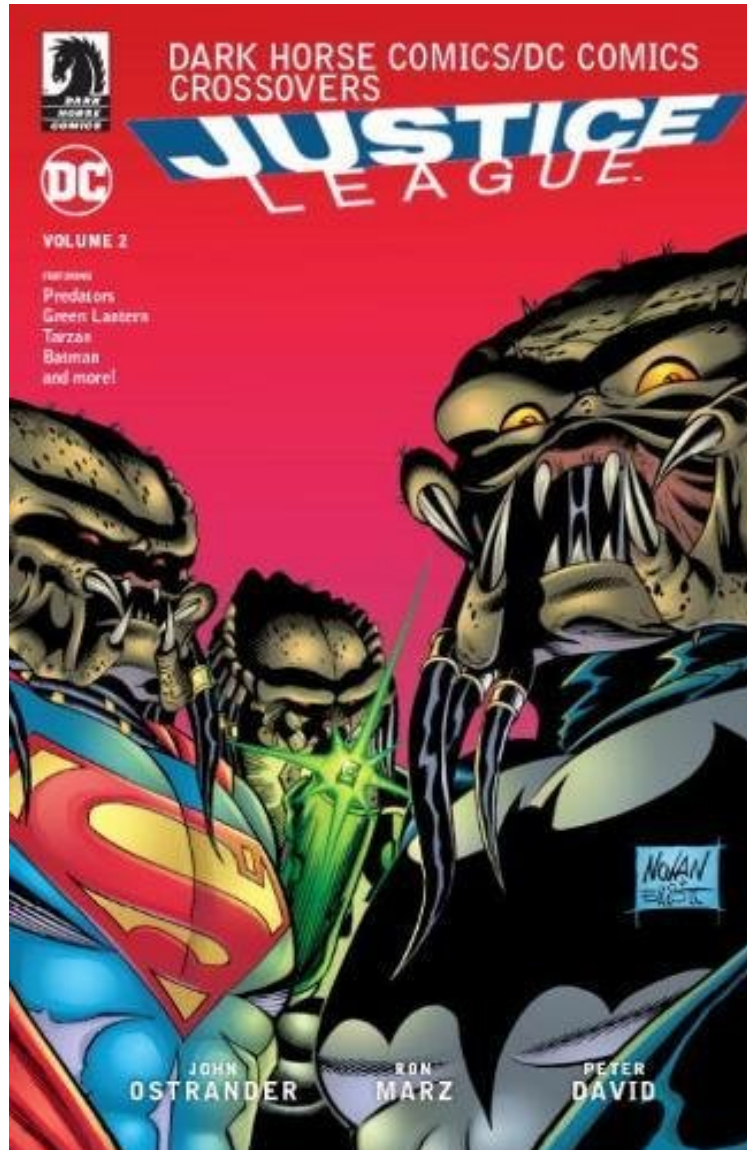

The best one--and the one which I wish would have been extended hundreds of pages further--is the JLA vs Predator. What if Predators gained access to super powers via genetic tampering by a third race

of aliens? This one answers the question. Cool fights. Not long enough. Decent artwork. The writers did not know how to handle the "Superman Predator" very well. The resolution was a hacky, silly experience. Otherwise, the other Predators mimicking the JLA characters were pretty darn scary. The Green Lantern story was much more satisfying and scary. It spans the careers of a couple of Lanterns. The innocent mistake of one impacts the life of another future Lantern. And possibly the universe. You cannot allow these aliens to live. Sometimes, a pacifist guardian must become a killer. Hordes of aliens vs. one Green lantern a team of former heroes. Very cool. You get the idea. The stories that follow are excellent as well. The art actually gets better as you go, so this book is a visual treat as well as an imaginative hero/monster mash-up. This is why we buy comics. The first two stories in this volume, JL/Predators and Batman/Tarzan, are great. Great stories, great art (especially Batman/Tarzan). But the young justice spyboy story left me cold. First, I've never heard of spyboy, second I thought the story was dumb. But it is worth getting for the first two.

In this collection of DC Comics crossovers, Dark Horse brings never republished material featuring a host of heroes back to fans in a single volume. The JLA take on the most frightening hunters in the universe--the Predators--in adaptive superhero form! Batman teams up with Tarzan to resist the claws of the Catwoman as two orphan heroes protect their own jungles. Kyle Rayner must don the mantle of Green Lantern to turn back the tide of Aliens that Hal Jordan once permitted to live. Super-teens join forces as Spyboy and his friends work alongside Young Justice to defeat nightmarish foes.
