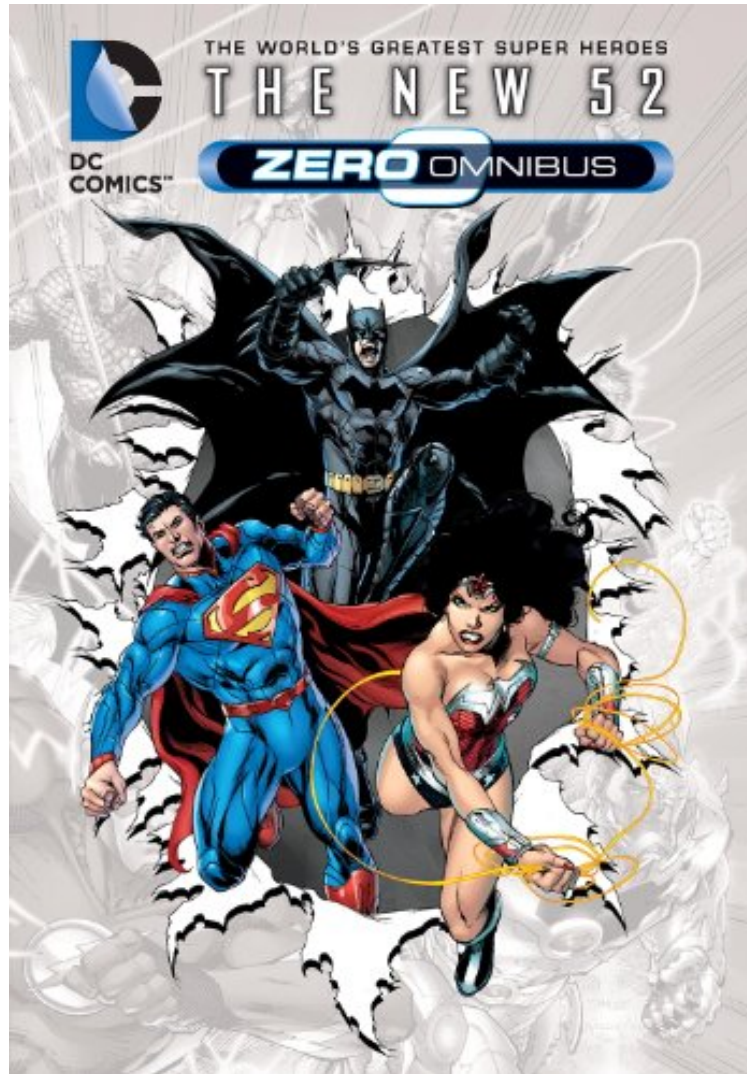

Now if you purchased the other DC new 52 Omnibus back in 2011 (which contained all #1 DC new 52 issues) like me and had some complaints, well most of them are solved with this. Let's start with content: Now there are 55 titles in this omnibus and each are about 30-40 pages, and about 80 percent are pure winners, the other 20 percent, not so much. It depends on the fan really. If you've read the origins to these heroes countless times, and are looking for something new, you might find about 50 percent of these origins a

waste of time, because for some issues, not a lot is new. But if you're a new reader, then you'll fall in love with this book. While some are rushed, it's impressive that most of these stories can stand alone with only 30-40 pages at its disposal. Stand outs are: Justice League, Batman and Robin, Batgirl, Superman, Talon, Aquaman, Wonder Woman, The Flash, and Swamp Thing (from my perspective). In all content is a B+ to A depending on your fan type. Now we have presentation: So if you got the other New 52 omnibus last year and your main problem was the binding was too tight, the issue still lies but not as much as last time. It's more comfortable to read this time, as you don't need to push down on a page to see that speech bubble that's hidden down near the middle. This time it's easier. There might be a few issues once and a while, but that thing isn't really an issue anymore. The only problem I have is when you close the omnibus it gets a bit unwieldy. Other than that this omnibus is an A! The Verdict: IN the end I had a blast with this omnibus. It's got great content, and is easier and more comfortable to read. I definitely recommend for any new DC fans, and old fans should give it a whirl when it goes on sale. I think you'll be pleasantly surprised!

From Booklist DC Comics marked the first anniversary of the company-wide overhaul of its superhero line by publishing issue zeroes of all 52 of its titles, depicting early events in the careers of its costumed crime fighters that occurred before the first issues of the revamped series. All of those untold stories are collected in this massive hardcover volume. The quality varies wildly: The best tend to feature DC's most iconic stars, such as Superman, Batman, and Wonder Woman, who get leading writers like Grant Morrison, Scott Snyder, and Brian Azzarello; or outré creations like Swamp Thing and Animal Man that somehow seem to fly under the corporate radar. Too many of the rest are undistinguished (and somewhat indistinguishable) products that frequently veer toward the sordid and sport the frenzied, cluttered visual approach that serves as DC's house style. Only the most-avid fans will have been following the exploits of all 52-plus of these characters, making the collection an opportunity for readers to sample some of DC's less-familiar comics (some of them already canceled).
