The Run in the title isn't kidding as the book quickly travels through a variety of scenarios as Deathstroke rushes to locate his missing daughter Rose. To figure out who has taken

her, Slade battles his way through a big cast of characters including Red Hood and the Suicide Squad. The Hood has been paid to slow Slade down while the Squad still maintains a grudge on Slade from his betrayal of them during the first volume of "New Suicide Squad." All in all, this is a solid book and sets up an intriguing new villain named Lawman who seems to be waiting in the wings for Deathstroke, but the book does move a bit too fast at times seemingly relying on tons of action over great character work.
