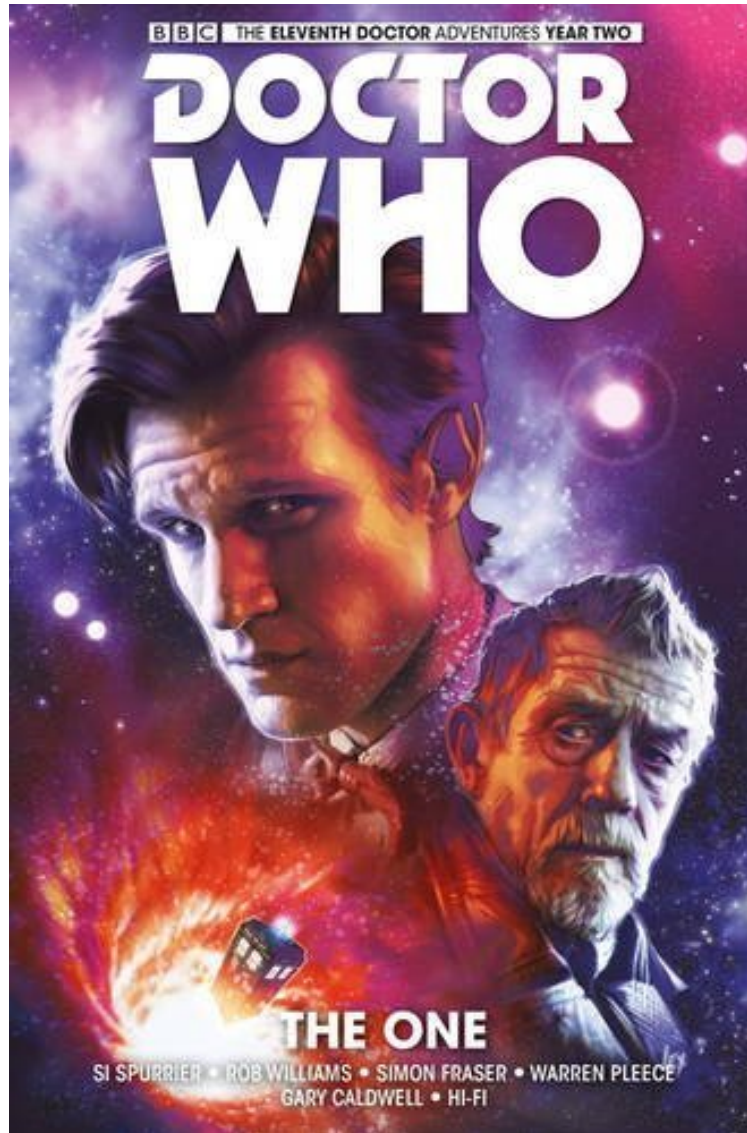

The Doctors Master Plan By Squirr-EI Doctor Who: The Eleventh Doctor Volume 5 - The One collects #6-10 of Year Two of Titan Books 11th Doctor comic book series. This 5-issue story is a serial, continuing on from Doctor Who: The Eleventh Doctor Vol.4: The Then and the Now (Uk Edition),

and continuing into the next volume. Anyway, this story once again hits the ground running, thanks to a bounty placed on the Doctors head by a race dying because of the actions of the War Doctor, though he thinks hes been framed, and the only way to prove it is to break into the Time-Lords secret prison planet of Shada, all knowledge of which he has wiped from his memory. Fortunately, River Song has joined the crew to help with this. One of the two writers is known for his mind-bending plots - see his recent Cable X-Force series for Marvel - and the artists also have form, so expect the unexpected, but also watch out for familiar signs and sights - for example, in the Fourth Doctors old office, where the crew are looking for a clue to Shadas whereabouts, on the table at the bottom of the panel is Orac, a teleport bracelet, and one of the Liberators handguns; and the space-suit that the doctor wears a bit later on is one of Dan Dares classic ones. This particular volume sees some strange mood-swings for the Doctor, and there are four main artists for the five issues, which might account for it. This was a very up and down volume, but hopefully things will even out in the next one.

Middle Part of an Epic Story By Adam Graham This book continues the story begun in Volume 4 which finds the Doctor trying to clear himself for a crime committed during the Time War where his memory is vague and the whole thing is time-locked. Joined by his companion Alice, as well as Absalom Daak, River Song, and the mysterious Squire (an alleged companion from the Time War), the Doctor seeks to unravel this mystery. The book once again features several solid mysteries with some mind-blowing Time Lord stuff that you couldn't portray on TV. There are some problematic elements. There's some frontmatter dedicated to a character profile of Daak which I'm not sure how it works. River Song is pretty quickly sidelined, and the Doctor spends much of the book being mean to Alice. Though, there's later an explanation for this. The book's ending certainly doesn't wrap things up but it does make Volume 6 a must-read. Despite it's problems, this is a truly awesome ride and I'm looking forward to reading how it wraps up.
