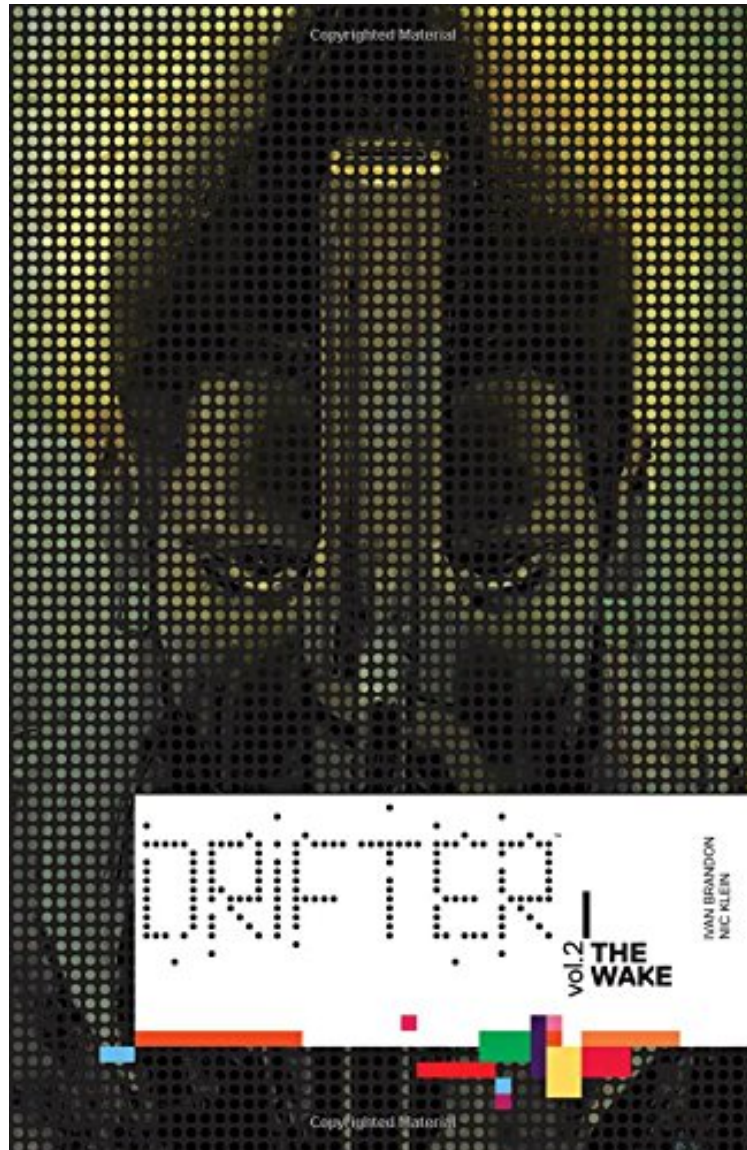

Love it or hate itBy Che CunninghamAnd here we have the second installation in the puzzling, nonlinear, deceptive, but nonetheless beautifully intriguing series that is Ivan Brandon and Nic Klein's Drifter. Volume 1 of this strange mashup of sci fi and Western introduced the main character Abram Pollux, a flight pilot who crash lands on the desolate planet of Ouro,

where humans are not the dominant species, and things are not at all what they seem. After being shot by a thick-coated, gunslinging man, and given rehabilitation by a sheriff in a local town, Pollux believes himself to have only been on the planet for "a few days." He discovers, however, that in reality his ship crashed on Ouro closer to a year ago, and his quest to both discover what happened and take revenge on his shooter propels the plot forward. Volume 2 sees the deep, dark mystery (whatever it is) lying at the heart of Drifter being slowly unraveled. With an expeditionary team collected from the town he's been taken into, Pollux travels to the site of his crashed ship. And there, he has an encounter that provides him with some information. Yet Ivan Brandon's writing in this series is nothing if not vague, cryptic, and something that just keeps readers guessing. Some answers are given, but they are subtle, mysterious, and appear to be missing some pieces, as if there's still more behind them that isn't yet being revealed. My guess is that he has one hell of a payoff in store for his audience. Overall this second volume of Drifter feels like a transition point of sorts: it SLIGHTLY begins to clear up the murky waters of questions posed in the first volume, while also setting itself up for something huge in the future. And suffice it to say that the final page is something that will make you question and rethink literally everything in the series that has happened up to that point. Drifter is a polarizing series; there's no way around it. For those who enjoyed the first volume, the question of whether this second one is worth getting boils down to personal preference. Do you like straight answers? Do you value clarity in writing? If "yes," you will most likely find yourself quite frustrated here that the huge cliffhanger from the first volume is not cleared up. But if you are interested in a different story structure, that revels in its own sense of mystery, quirkiness, and gives answers very very slowly and in small doses that only give rise to new questions.... then pick up this second trade. Because like it or not, there is one thing that cannot be questioned about Drifter, and it's this: this is unquestionably one of the most original titles on the stands right now, and readers are being treated (whether they know it or not) to something they haven't seen before with it.
