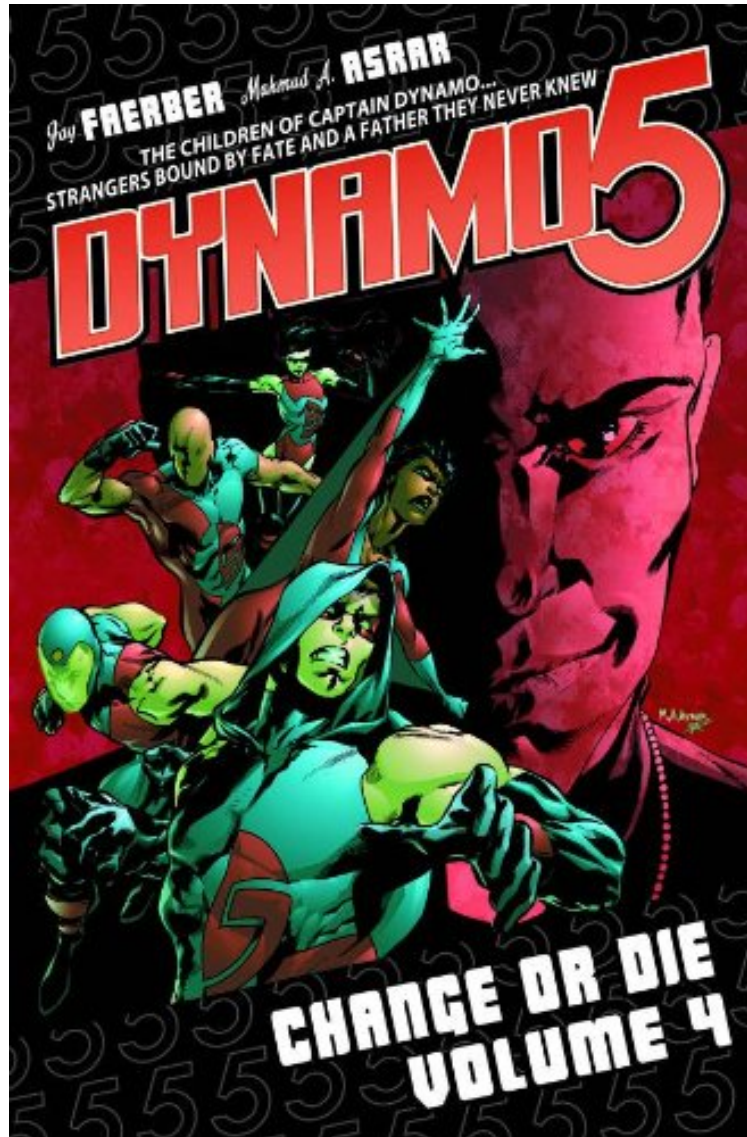

There's a half-hearted "hey kids, drugs are bad" storyline that benefits from a twist that fits well with the history of this title, but everything until the end is competent but not outstanding superhero storytelling. The end, though, is jaw-droppingly terrific. It's a huge development for these characters, and it opens a number of exciting new doors. I love the little epilogue stories, and I'm looking forward to the next volume. This book takes a while to get from good to great, but for a patient reader, there are some big rewards.
