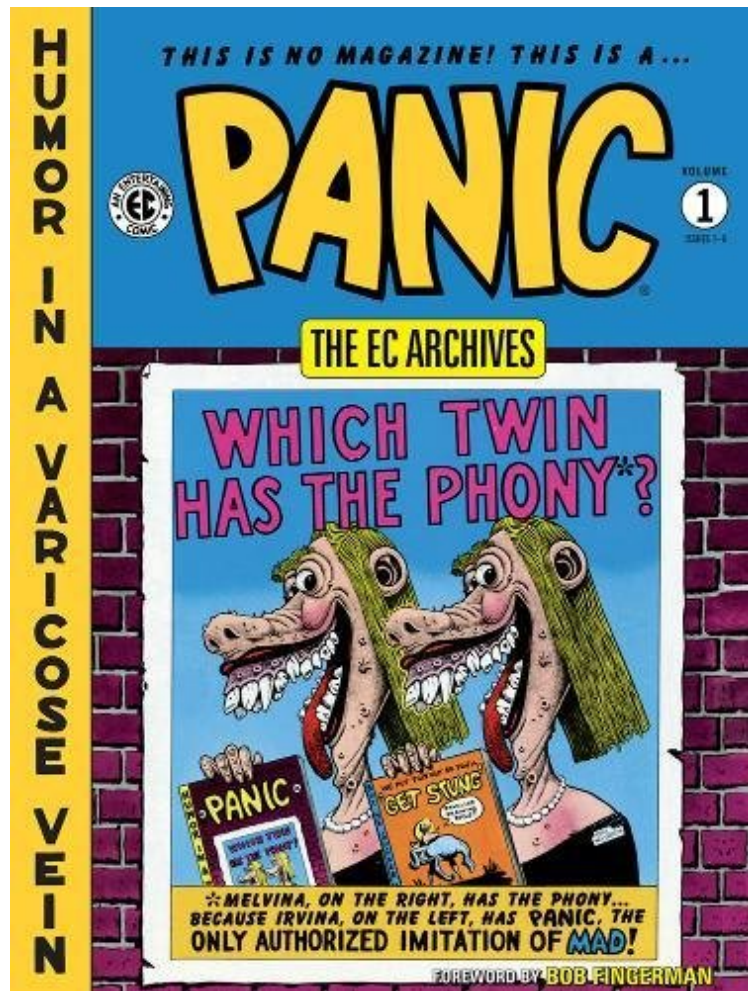

About the Author Albert Bernard Feldstein was an American writer, editor, and artist, best known for his work at EC Comics. He was also editor of the satirical magazine Mad from 1956 to 1985. After retiring from Mad, Feldstein concentrated on American paintings of Western wildlife
