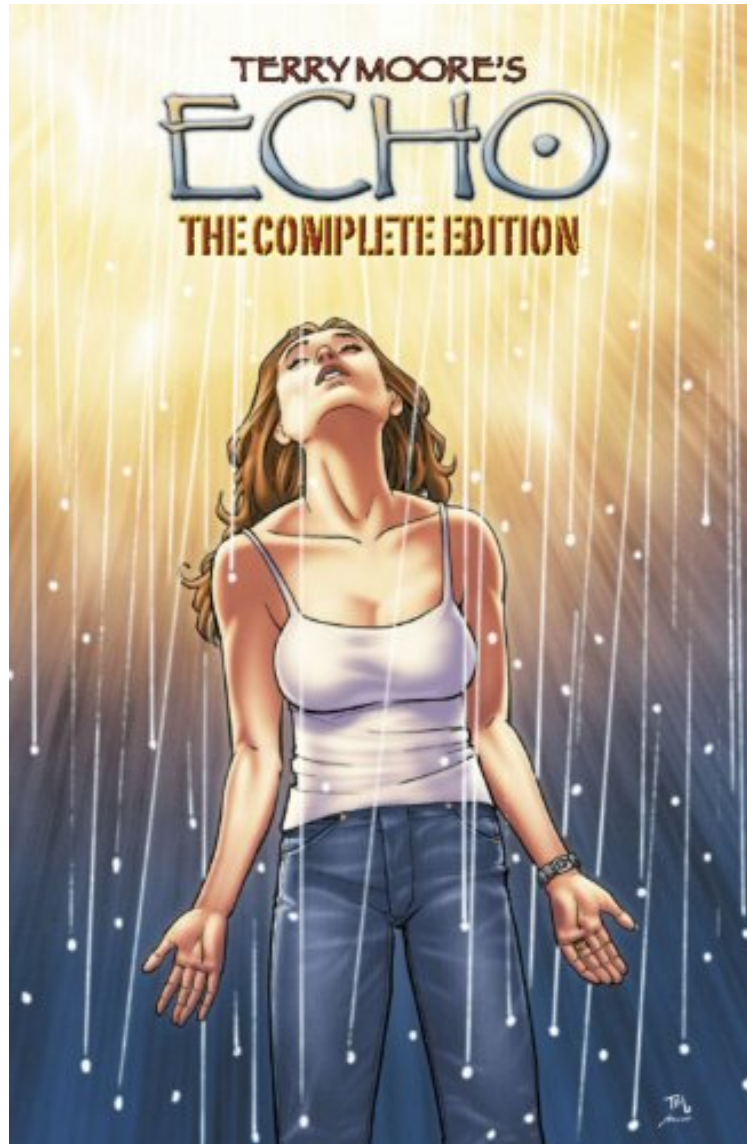

By Customer I love Terry Moore - the US graphic novel landscape is otherwise so terribly boring with all this hero-mystic that you do not find anywhere else in the world (try a German, French, Italian, or Belgian - or Argentinian comic store - it ranges in all directions, not only some kind of evil creatures messing up with technology and super heroes showing them their place and/or super sexy female heroes!) - Terry Moore is more fun, kind of less trivial, although this one is also about Sci-Fi and technological madness. But is a little less predictable than most Marvel or DC comics...
