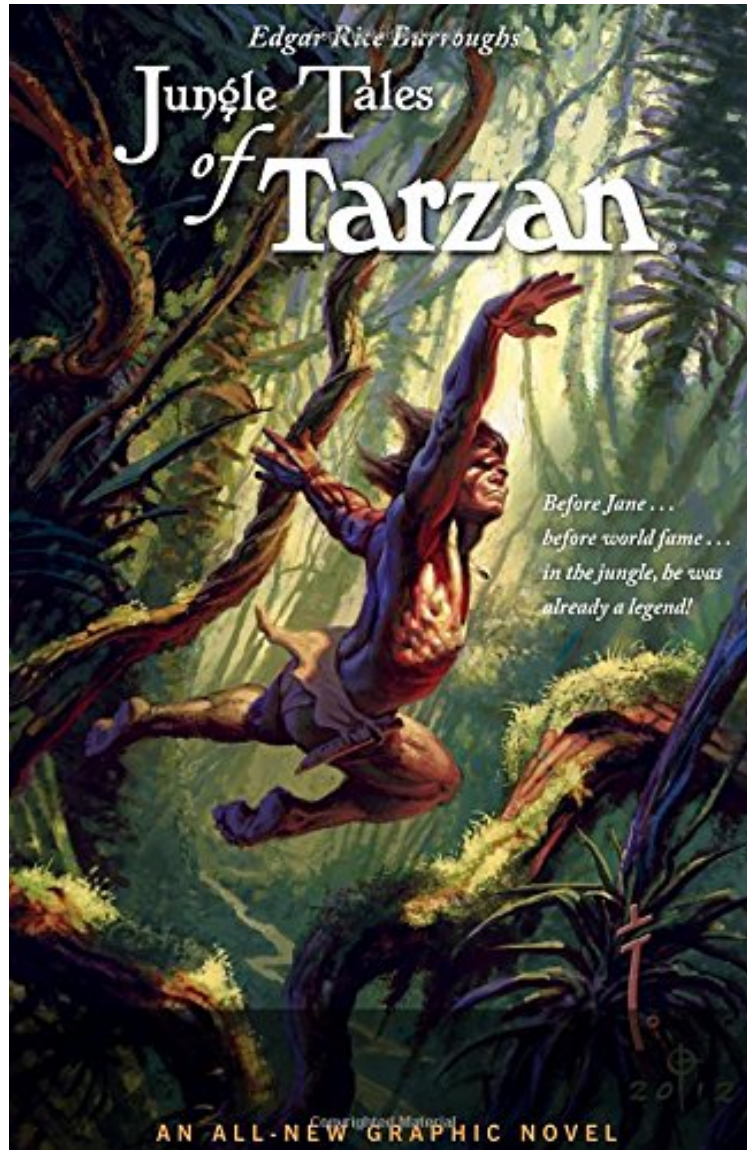

The sentiments expressed are real and genuine, albeit set in the fictional universe created for this character; they include notions of first love, questions about the existence of God, loyalty to friends, and the concept of vengeance, to name a few. Each story in the volume is illustrated in a different style, and you will certainly be able to find a favorite artist among the many represented.
