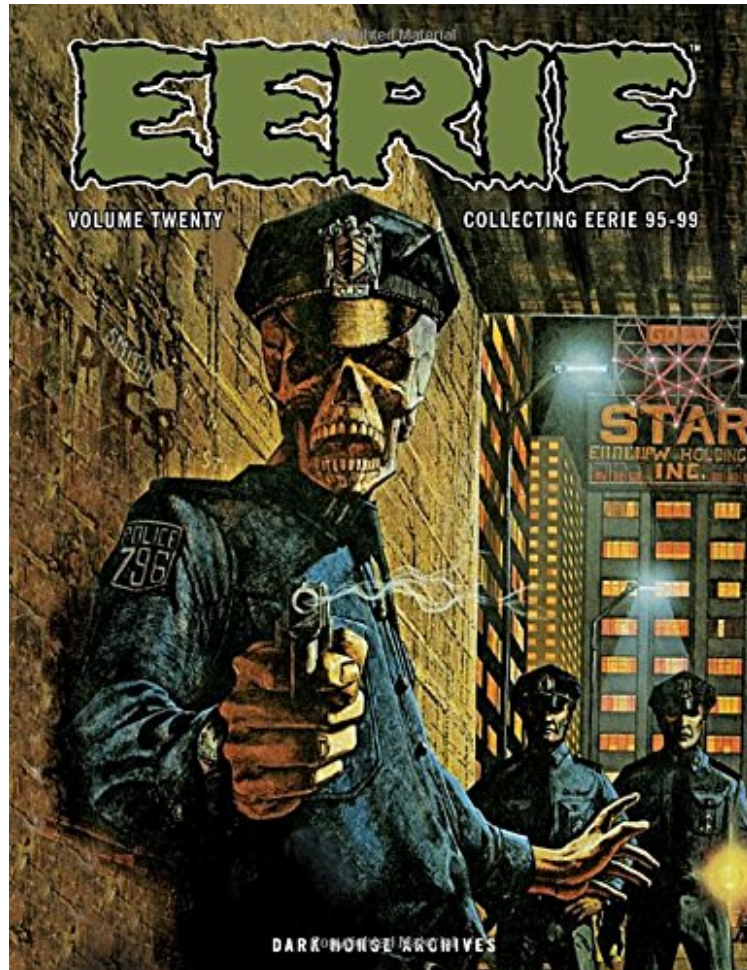

The covers -2 Ken Kelly covers (1 of which is the dust jacket), 2 Sanjulian covers, and 1 Enrich cover. they are all spectacular. The art is inventive and of gallery status, Jose Bea and Maroto stand out but there isn't any bad art in the whole book. The editors are toying with color in this volume, we see a two color 1 page experiment and it is exceptional. Full blown color is soon to follow, it wasn't easy to do in those days, and we aren't talking comic book color, we are talking rich full tonal colors that will dazzle Corben's art and others. The writing is getting better but the "everyone's a werewolf in the Family" endings were hurting the magazine, but they are fewer and fewer in this volume. And the first holiday issue, with the dust jacket painting and blurbs like "blood on the snow!" and "special

holiday issue!" (I think the blurbs help the painting sometimes.) Welcome to christmas Warren style, the movies would soon follow suit and present "black" xmas movies.
