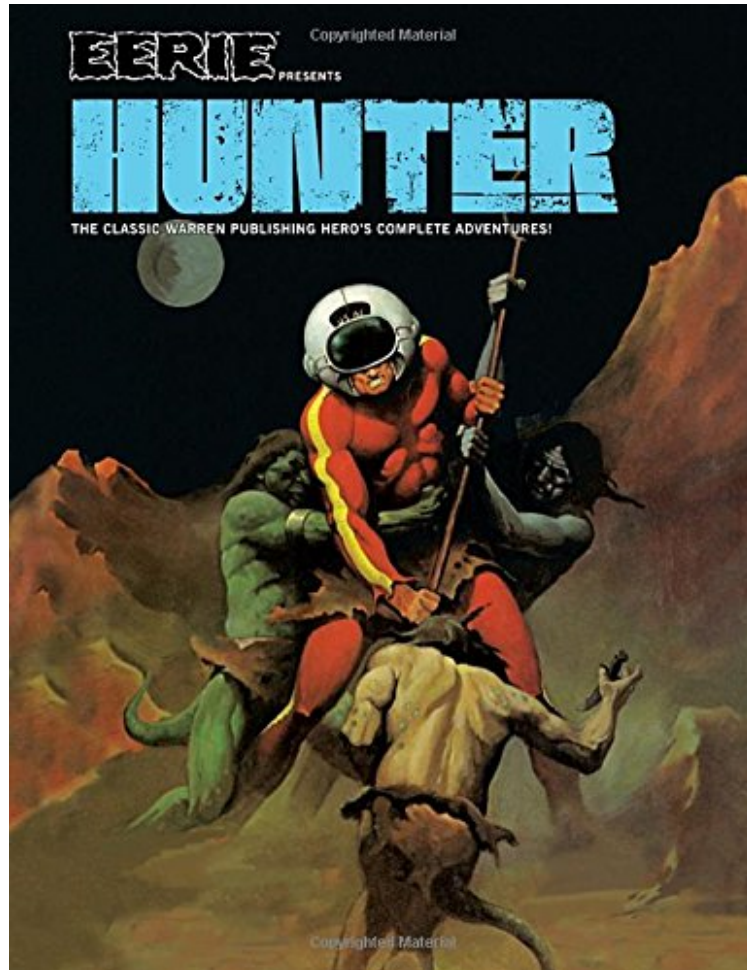

I know originally this series would have been released in a large format magazine style comic and it just doesn't translate well to the smaller scaling. The Kindle version also doesn't feature any type of panel zooming, so
