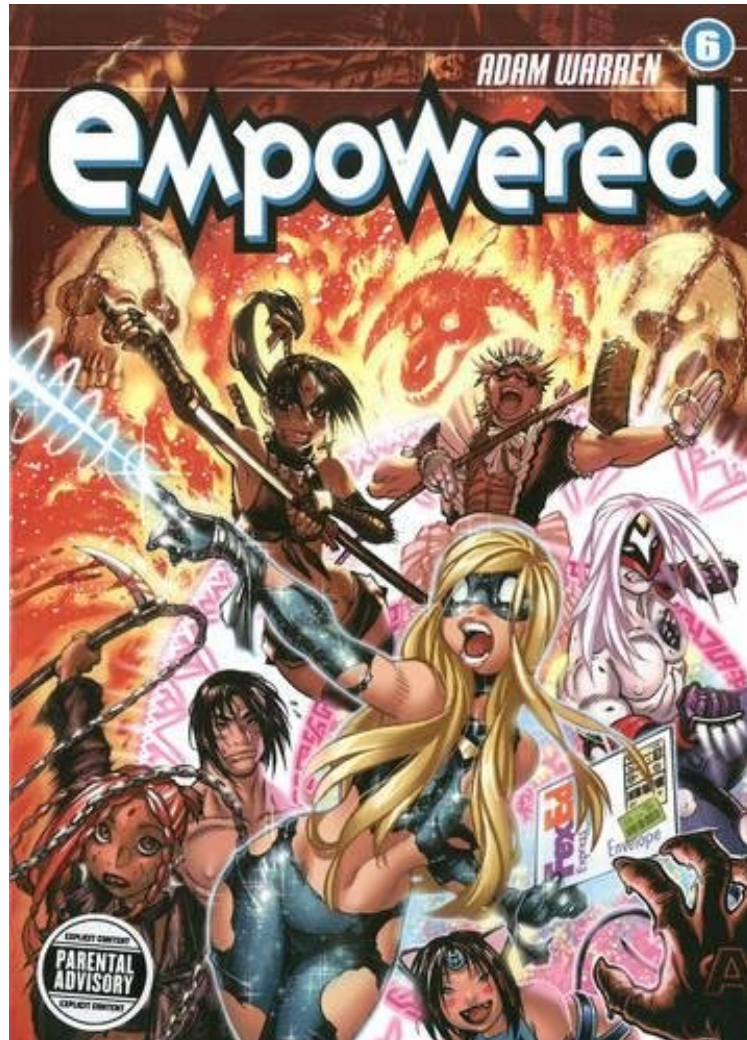

By Kid Kyoto Empowered is the story of a struggling (often literally) 'cape' trying to be a heroine despite her unreliable powers, bullying teammates and bad luck. This volume Emp and her other misfit heroes (the cross-dressing Batman parody Maidman, the hard-drinking Ninjette and the mystical Sistah Spooky must protect a group of not-quite-dead heroes from the fearsome Deathmonger. Until now Empowered has been mainly about Emp's friendships and relationships rather than super heroics. With this volume though the action takes center stage as Emp has to out-think and out-fight a villain that has other heroes running scared. It's great to see her becoming more skilled and competent as the series goes on. But don't

worry; Adam Warren's trademark humor is still there. Who else would throw in a few pages of pirate-scanned yaoi comics or a cameo appearance of Were-Giraffe-by-Night? While doing all this he manages to find a fresh and tragic angle on the cliché of heroes coming back from the dead and drops several teasers for big events coming up. Oh and did I mention we finally see Emp's secret origin? Empowered remains the freshest, funniest and most human superhero comic on the market.
