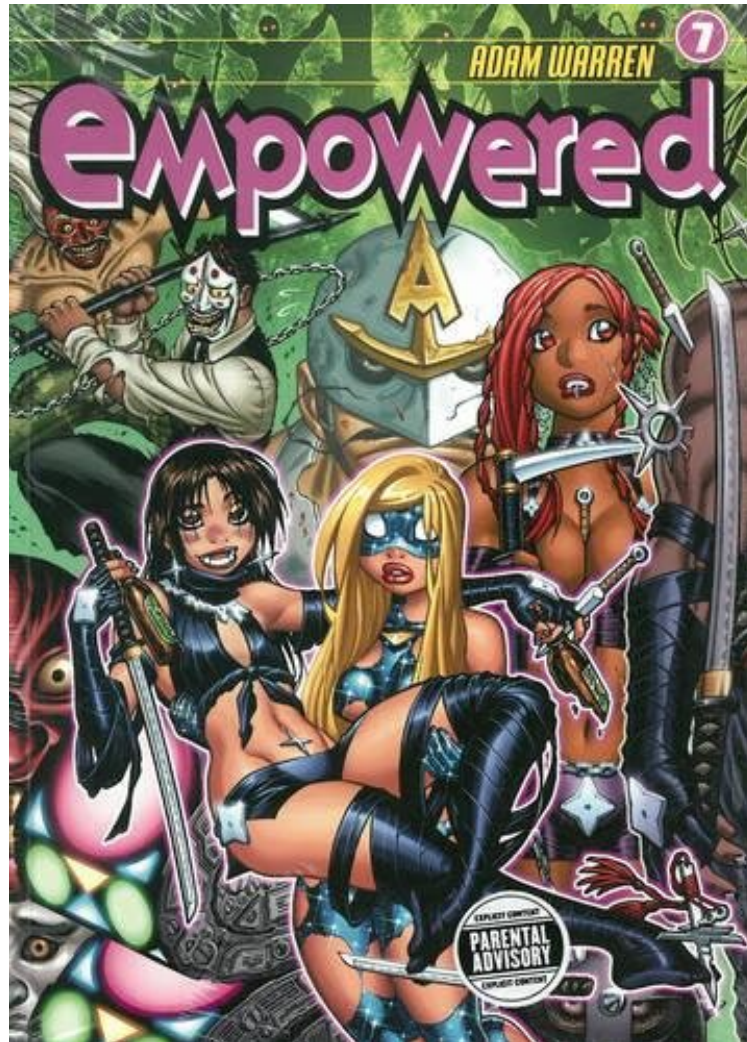

So Little MaidmanBy Barnard RollitIn case anyone's concerned that Emp's story gets somewhat sidelined in this volume, well, yeah, it kinda does--in fact, at one point Emp herself has some pretty terse remarks to make on that score. I don't think she or anyone else has much to worry about though. As much focus as there is on Ninjette, Emp remains the character around which everything turns. She even startles Major Havoc with a piece of information that has had this reader perplexed since vol. 5, and while the matter involved is hardly cleared up, it's also clear we're in for wild ride when Warren finally brings it front and center.As for that scene between Ninjette and the Caged Demonwolf...it is pretty surprising and very illuminating, but I'm not sure about its

effect at this point. It's as if I've learned more than I really wanted to about everyone's favorite coffee table centerpiece, and as a result can't help feeling his relationship with the other characters and the readers will never be the same. That said, I've enough trust in Warren's storytelling powers to believe he'll make it pay off. If there's one outright disappointment for me, it's that Maidman is limited to a cameo role. Since his first appearance I've been a great fan of The Frilly Fury, and am aching to know what's up with those notes pinned to his worse-for-wear costume in volume 6.5 of 5 people found the following review helpful. By ChibiNeko I have to say, with all of the various big and little screen adaptations, I'm a little surprised that nobody has thought to option this series. While the idea of a female superhero being easily disrobed might give some pause, there's a lot to this series that merits a deeper look. This really was an amazing volume. We get a deeper look into Ninjette's psyche and background here, which shows us that she's far from the cute little sidekick-type character that she initially felt like. Emp is more of a background character in this volume, which took me a while to get used to. She's easily one of my favorite characters in the series, although a volume focusing around Ninjette has been a long time coming. We get to see exactly how awful her home life was, which was pretty awful. We also get a brief look into Oyuki's past as well, and let's just say that she had it pretty bad as well. I have to say that my absolute favorite chapter in this book had to be the bath scene between the Caged Demon Wolf and Ninjette. It's probably one of the most tender scenes I've seen in the series so far, not to mention a little romantic. This might be a little spoilerish, but it's revealed in the first few pages that much like the aliens in Slaughterhouse Five, the CDW is capable of viewing all of the various points in time at any given moment. What this will mean for future volumes is unknown, but I had to give Warren props for bringing this in. It's a nice touch and brings more oomph to the CDW's character. I'm somewhat looking forward to the next volume, as it looks like it's going to bring a lot of various issues to a head. I'm a little worried that this might mean more bodies hitting the floor, but the story is so engaging at this point that I can't help but feel frustrated that it's going to be at least another 1-2 years before the next volume is released. (There are scenes that Warren cut out of this volume that he'll put in the next volume, so here's hoping that this means that volume 8 will be released sooner!) I enjoyed it a great deal, but felt it wasn't on the same level as Books Four, Five, and Six. Still there are must-read chapters that make this volume a requirement for fans; in particular the scene with the Caged Demonwolf and a black-out drunk Ninjette. So while Book Seven was entertaining, my minor complaint is that our heroes didn't seem to get much done. I'm hoping in the next installment we'll see more character development and more resolution to some of the mysteries to which Warren's series has been alluding.
