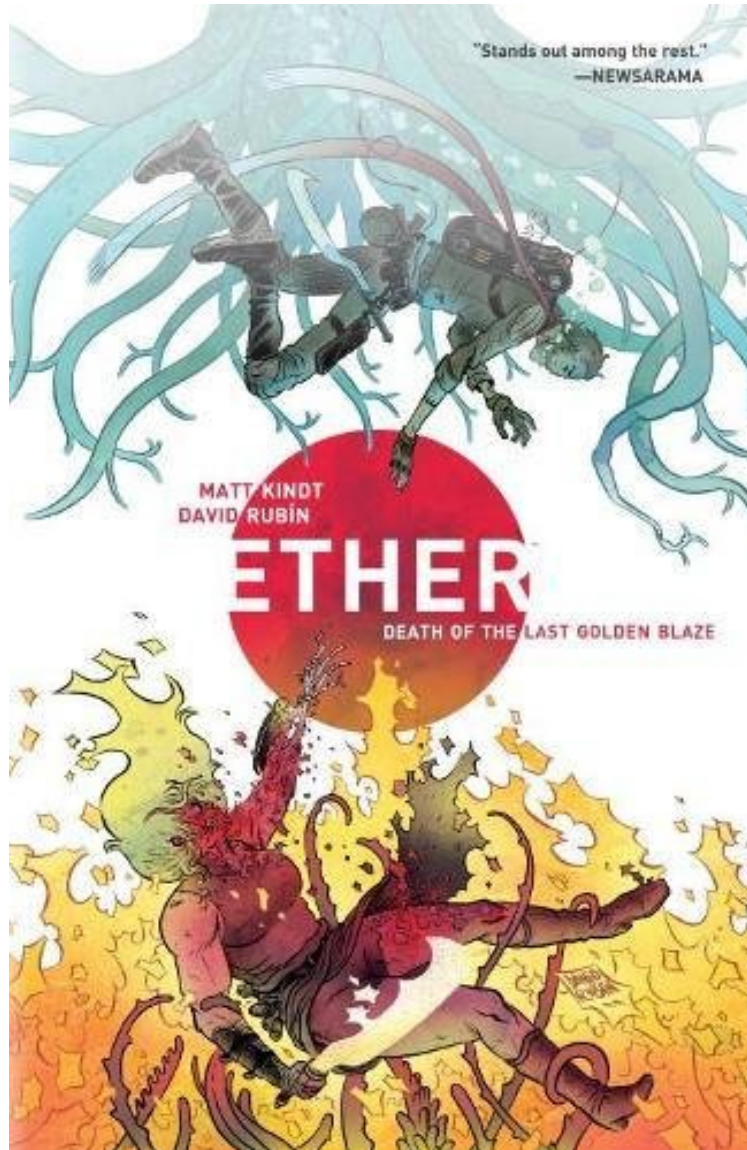

Matt Kindt has been creating a lot of interesting books the past few years for Dark Horse and Valiant. But this... probably has almost everything I want out of comic. Dave Rubin offers a vivid, fantastic fantasy world unmoored by classic portrayals. Magic bullets look like babies. Taxis are giant, animated squids puffing around the sky. The mystical escort into the Ether REALM is a purplish baboon with a surly sense of humor. It's fresh and exciting. Rubin's approach is off-kilter and despite its occasional failings - I notice his background details are a litttttllle off in a few places - it makes up with cartoonish vigor. Kindt for his part creates characters and settings with depth. The lead is Boone Dias, an explorer from Earth, attempting to bring a scientific understanding to the illogical world of magic. Think Sherlock Holmes meets fantasy. His obsession with the Ether has cut deep emotional and personal trauma in him and others. I enthusiastically suggest people check this out. A great little series.
