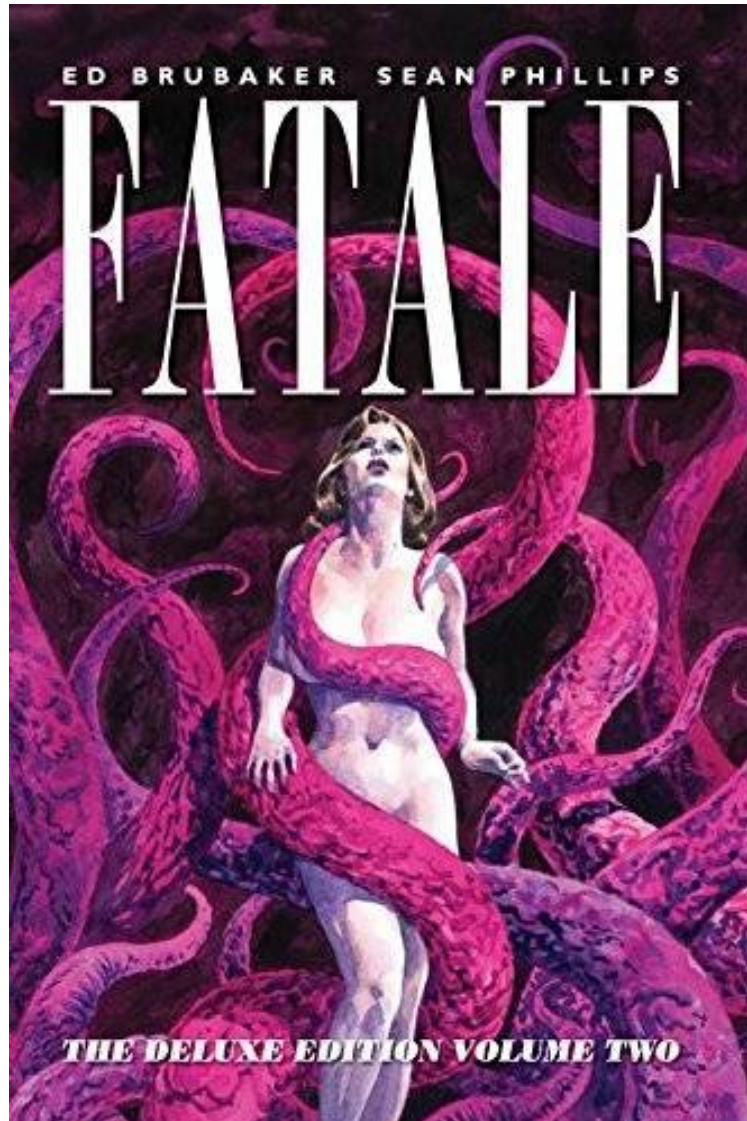

Hardcover collection of the second half of a great noir/horror/scifi comicBy TreetownThis is the hard cover second volume that collects the conclusion to the Fatale comic series by Brubaker and Phillips that was put out by Image comics.If you are looking at this you probably know the basic story, if you stumbled here by mistake, read the earlier reviews for Volume 1 or the softcover collections (I think there are five). Very briefly the plot concerns an alluring woman; men who cross her path become drawn to her and their lives

are pulled inside out - but unlike some melodrama, this is actually a noir suspense horror sci-fi work with Lovecraftian elements. We discover that Josephine's power over men and women who love women is not accidental and is part of an ancient cycle. She is pursued by monsters and their human servants who want to use her as part of a sacrificial rite. I know this sounds all over the place but it very well done, and wonderfully illustrated. Some may criticize how the principal plot was resolved but the ending seems appropriate. Nearly everyone is on the "the losing side of eternity". 2 of 2 people found the following review helpful.
