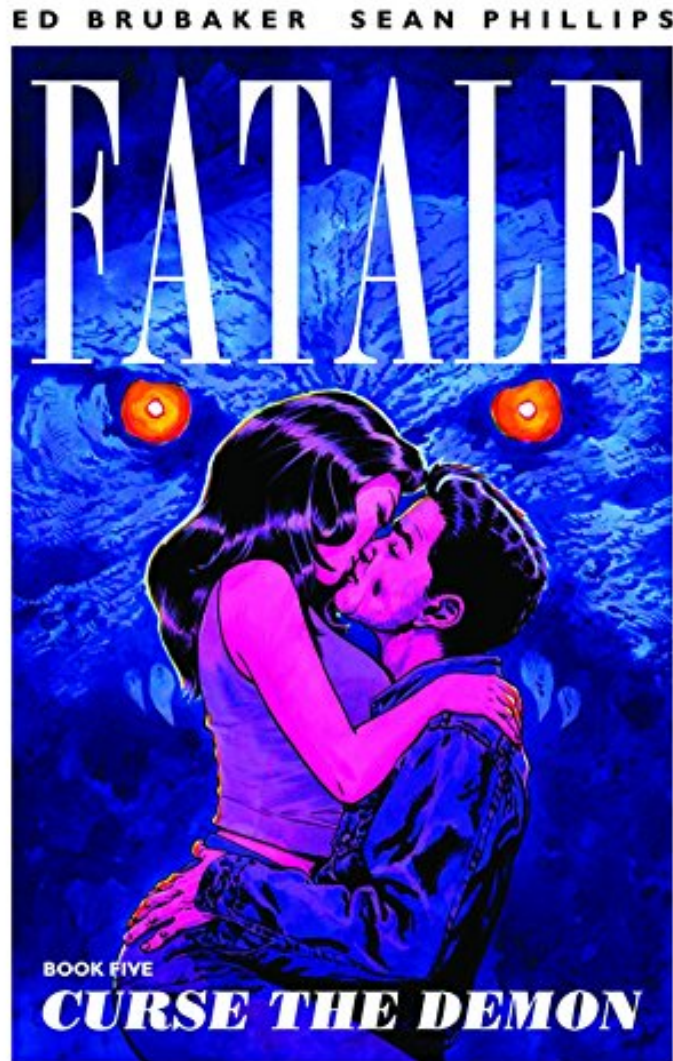

For all my love of these pairing, Fatale has never quite lived up to what I wanted it to be. The mythology was never quite fleshed out, but too much of it was shown for it be

effectively shrouded in mystery. This confounds it as Nicholas Lash frame story becomes the story which elements of all the other flash backs since the 1940s story beginning to add up to something clear. However, most of the central mysteries of the book, including the actual nature of the antagonists and Josephine herself simply aren't really wrapped up. Jo is given a satisfying ending as is Nicholas in the terms of their arc, but not in the terms of the central mythology that Brubaker builds. That said, as anti-climatic as this book was, the final confrontation allows Phillips to go nuts with some of the horror elements of the story. This changes the feel of the book, but some of the sex and violence are drawn more weirdly, and this is in complete keeping with the genre. 2 of 2 people found the following review helpful.
