0 of 0 people found the following review helpful. Weak Tie-ins to the Flashpoint Arc By clairetoldmetochangemyscreenname World of Flashpoint has some great tie-ins (specifically the Batman issues), but

this volume is not one of them. Over the top in all the worst ways, The Flash tie ins feature a decent intro for Reverse-Flash centered on his decision to murder Nora Allen (which sets off the whole Flashpoint event in a way) and then shows what Grodd, Captain Cold, the Rogues, and Bart Allen were up to in the Flashpoint timeline. Grodd's chapter is the best, but over too quickly. Apparently he's conquered Gorilla City and most of Africa. Captain Cold is actually a hero known as Citizen Cold (something we were told during the main Flashpoint arc), only for it to turn out he's still a thief and is merely posing as a hero and killing the other Rogues to cement his hero status. Heatwave is incarcerated in the Legion of Doom's headquarters (in this world a prison) where he tries to lead a riot alongside a villainous Plastic Man. Bart Allen is now a time-displaced paradox because Barry has changed the past and is thus stuck in an alternate future where Brainiac has taken over the world. All in all, none of these stories are particularly that good. Bart's story is okay, but ends with a random tie in to the main Flashpoint story that is never mentioned therein. Cold and Heatwave's stories are the worst. I liked the idea of Cold as an anti-hero (something he literally has become in recent JL stories like Forever Evil), but here he is still cartoonishly over the top so it is hard to see why he convinced anyone he wasn't evil. The Heatwave story is just lame when it could have been awesome (a Flashpoint prison break) but Heatwave isn't a solid enough character to carry the arc. The most interesting chapter, like I said, is Grodd's. I would have loved to see more of him as a world conqueror instead of a brief chapter. All of the stories are also notable for being hyper-violent. While I'm okay with violence in comics, some instances here just felt like overkill for the sake of shock value (Heatwave popping Atom's head, Plastic Man smuggling himself into prison inside Cluemaster's body and then erupting out of him like an Alien). Overall, a very skippable tie-in as it offers nothing of major value to the overall Flashpoint arc.
