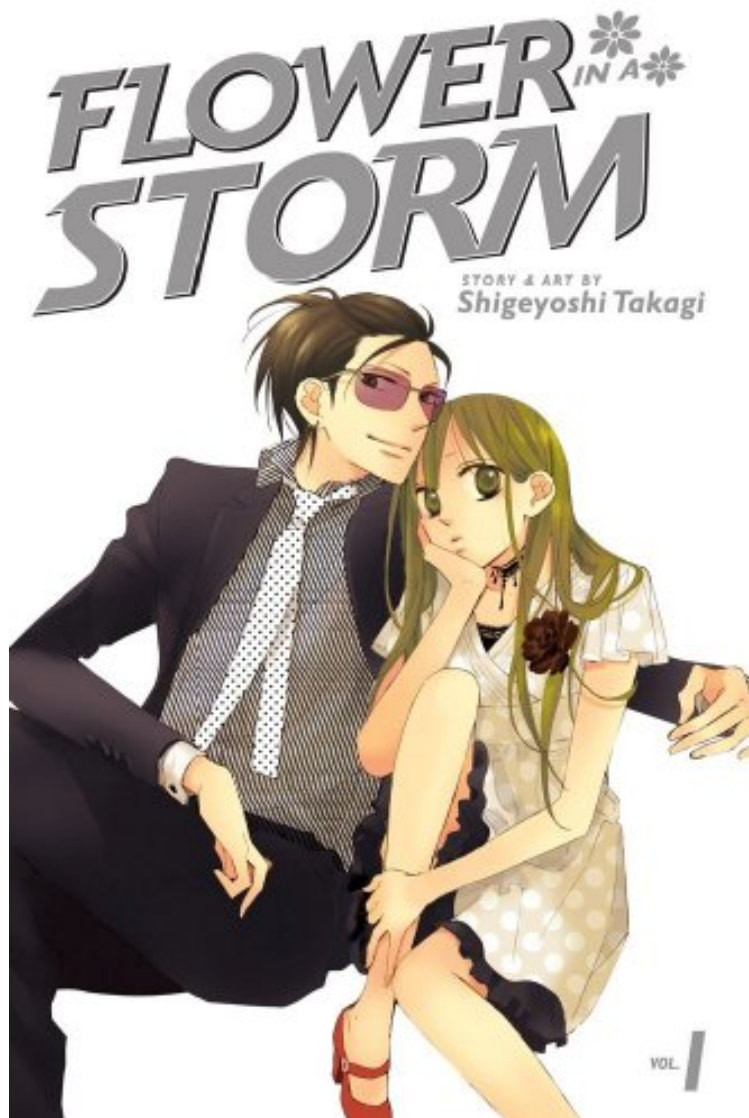

Ran, the richest, most powerful 17-year-old in Japan wants her as his wife, and he's not taking no for an answer! If Ran can't capture her by five o'clock the next day, he'll give up on her, but he has all that money can buy at his disposal. However, Riko has one trick up her sleeve--she has superpowers!

From BooklistRiko Kunimi is a regular 17-year-old girl in an average suburban high school. Shes trying to fit in like everyone else, but two things make it very difficult. First, she has superhuman strength, and second, Ran Tachibanathe richest and most powerful 17-year-old in Japanwants to marry her. Really, Riko has no say in the matter, because Ran will employ every part of his vast resources to catch her in the worlds most expensive game of cat and mouse. Ultimately, the premise is abandoned in favor of chronicling Rans over-the-top antics; but one cannot blame Takagi for jumping ship. While brash and slightly dumb, Ran is a hilarious standout in this harmless fluff piece. Even the delicate black-and-white renderings of Riko, the heroine, pale to the detail found on Ran. A hidden gem is Takagis poignant short, included at the end of the manga, called The Need for Artificial Respiration.
