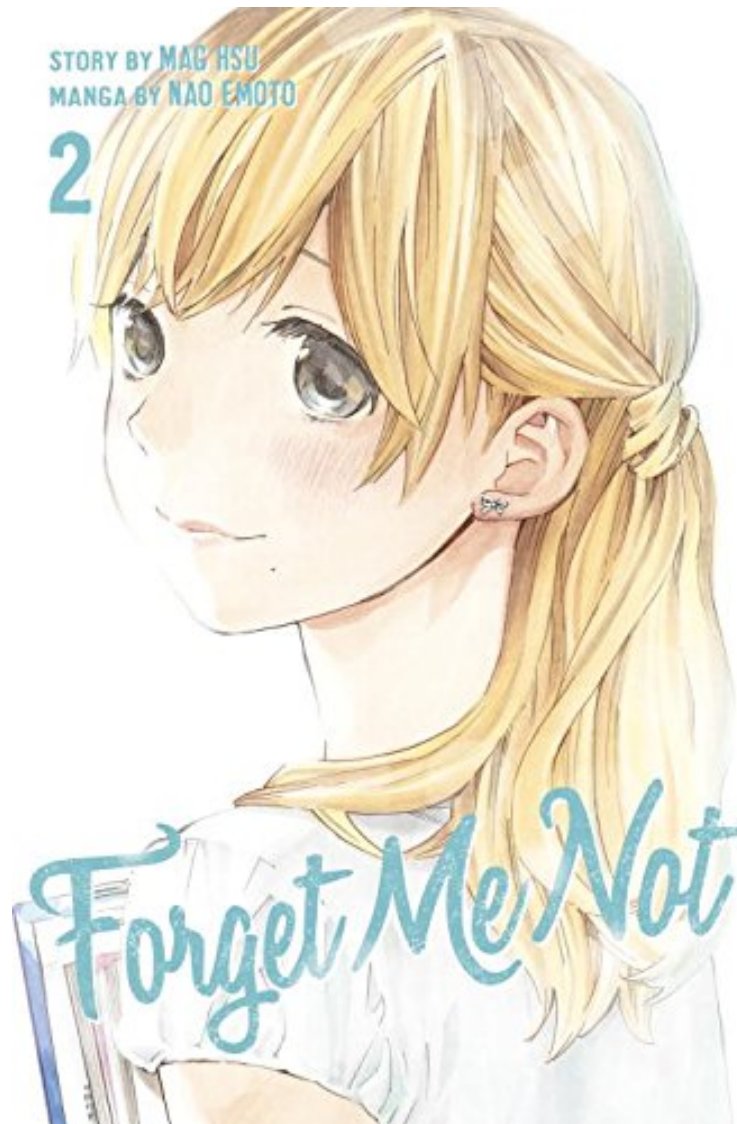

The second volume of *Forget Me Not* has a lot less of Serizawa being either brutalized or brutalizing others, but plenty of angst. His crush on his teacher comes to its conclusion. It's heartbreaking and humiliating for Serizawa, and he struggles with how to treat her afterwards. He's not entirely successful in behaving well, but it's hard to blame him given his shock and pain. Unless you're Serizawa himself, since this is supposedly one of the relationships he's giving as proof that he knows "what it's like to shatter a romance by hurting the one you love." His behavior with next two women he meets only reinforced my feeling that Serizawa just isn't that strong as a person. He tends to react more than he charts his own course. I remember feeling uneasy (the first time I read it) about how he was going to mess things up, as I watched the situation take shape. Reading it the second time wasn't any more reassuring.
