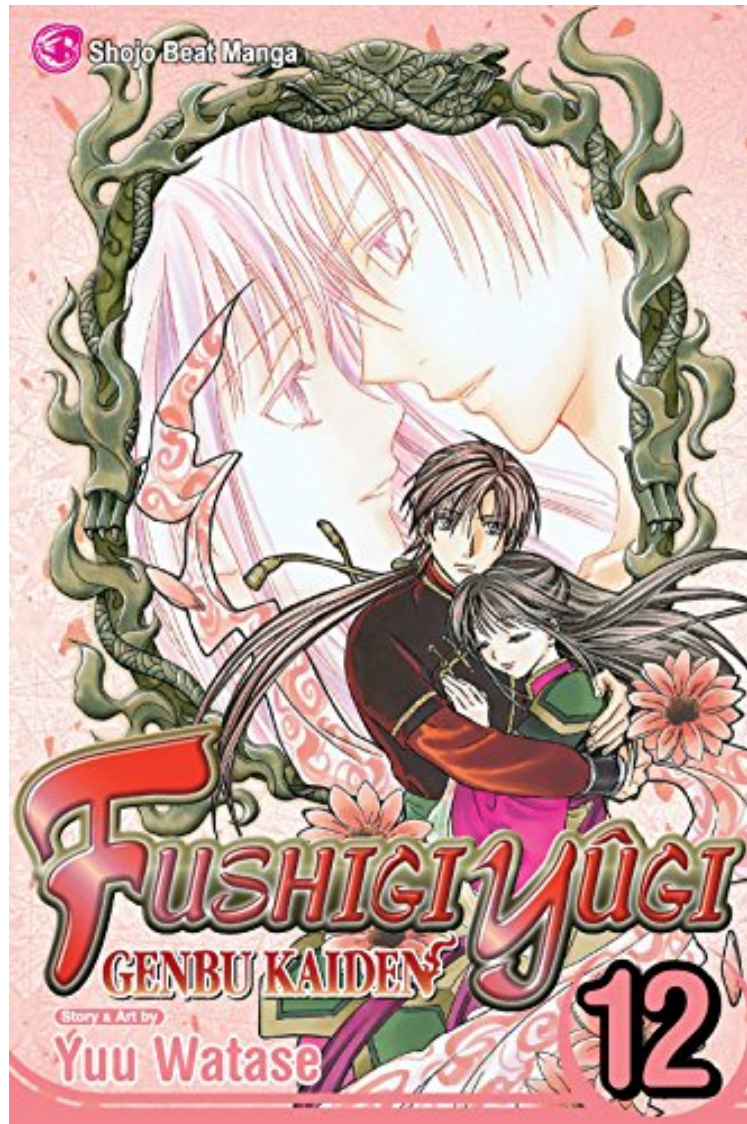

You can tell how much Watase loves these characters, how much she wanted to give the series the right ending. I loved the scenes where Takiko summons Genbu and makes her wishes, especially how Watase isn't afraid to make it gruesome and ugly. There were one or two moments that made me go, "Wait, how does that work, exactly?" But they were minor and didn't really detract from my enjoyment.
