This is artistic reference here- it's not a graphic novel by any means. A few observations...- all main vehicles weapons from the 1st season are here.- character sketches include just about everyone who appeared in the 1st season, including minor bit characters.- Dusty's name here is Ronald W. Tador. In the cartoon series he's called "Dusty Rudat"- his last name flipped around. An artist named Ron Rudat contributes.- the Dreadnoks' real names here are Tom Winken (Torch), Dick Blinken (Buzzer), and Harry Nod (Ripper). Tom, Dick and Harry!- character pages often have memorable quotes, some from the backs of the actual 80's G.I. Joe toys.- we even get the lyrics to "Cold Slither". These are black white model sheets for the hit 80's cartoon series- This is mainly for artists art enthusiasts. People looking for a regular comicbook or story will definitely need to
