I'm sure many older comicbook fans will appreciate it as well, as it pokes fun at the genre's long-established conventions with lighthearted spoofs of groups like the Justice League, SHIELD, etc.The vibe is very similar to kid-friendly comics such as "Tiny Titans" and "Mini Marvels" (which Giarrusso works on) but unlike those titles, "G-Man" is a self-contained story and readers don't have to know any of the past mythologies of the DC or Marvel universes to get the jokes: "G-Man" is funny all by itself. Volume Three shows Chris Giarrusso in peak form -- the series has been established and is running on all cylinders, a giddy, hilarious, joyful and thoroughly enjoyable romp into a world of super-powered kids and super-clueless adults. But when the G-Brothers return to a world of giant robots and demon hunters, they barely have a chance to catch their breath before the real danger begins! The Suntrooper Space Force is called into action, the Thunderfriends assemble, and the Color Guardians unite as G-Man and Great Man face their biggest threat yet!

From School Library JournalGr 3-7G-man is a young superhero who gets his powers from a magic cape. He and his brother, Great Man, have just returned to a city they saved from a nuclear explosion; its inhabitants thought they were dead. The boys connect with their fellow kid superheroes, including the Color Guardians and the Demon Hunters, and their adult allies, a motley crew called the Thunderfriends. While this series contains the action, banter, and excitement of superhero stories, it also pokes irreverent, affectionate fun at their tropes. The Color Guardians bicker over their proper titles, a godlike superhero solemnly explains why he's never heard of pizza, and the final, climactic scene depicts a battle with a vicious stork.
