There is tons of sex and violence (what else do you expect from Gantz?) and Hiroya Oku is able to make the action scenes interesting and novel each and every time. No spoilers, but there is an interesting twist between the vampires and the aliens. A new female character named Anzu Yamasaki is introduced and I hope Oku decides to keep her around because she is interesting and fun. Also the vampire character
