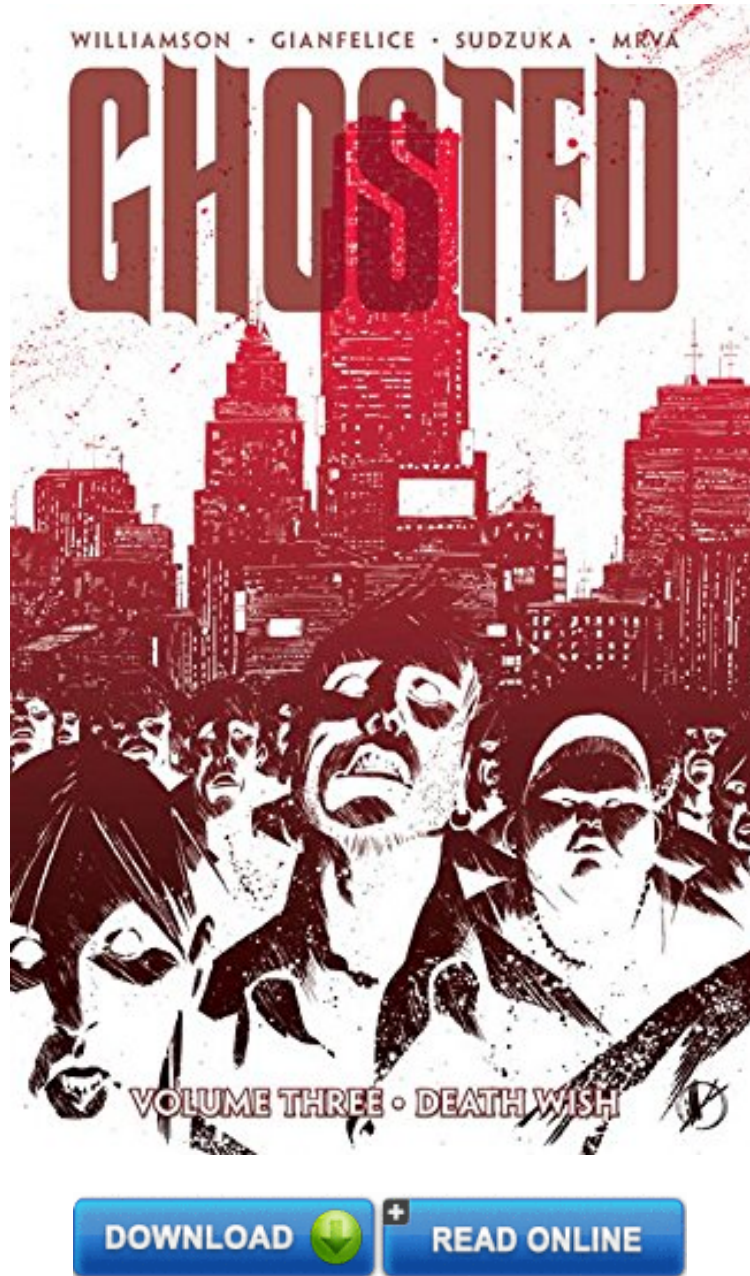

IIVolume 3 is better than volume 2. This volume starts with Jackson in jail (just like volume 1), but he is now haunted by Anderson (who died in volume 1). We learn some more about Anderson's back story. Eventually, an old friend (I use that term loosely) shows up to offer Anderson a deal (it's not really an offer). Jackson is introduced to a lawman

who could be a Texan played by bearded Tommy Lee Jones or Jeff Bridges - a serious old man. Nina and Trick's son also appear in this volume (both introduced in volume 2). At times, some of the dialogue is hokey and the action predictable, but overall, this is an entertaining tale.
