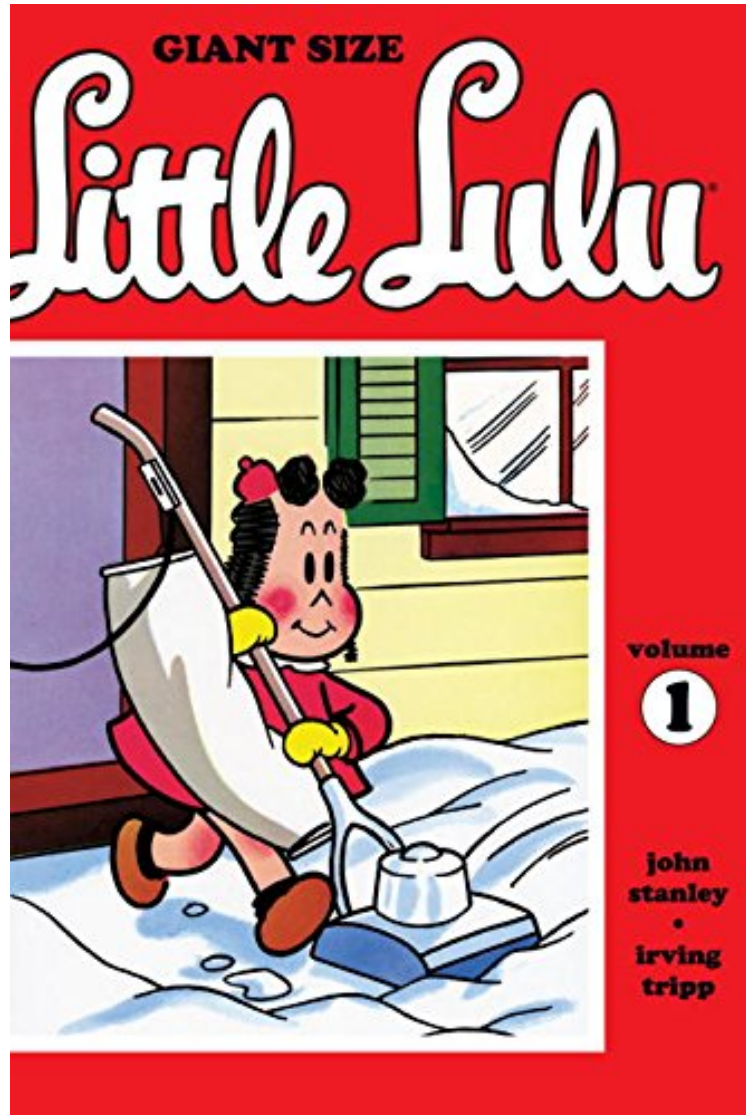

"Little Lulu" was a one-panel cartoon in the Saturday Evening Post from 1935 to 1944 from creator Marjorie Henderson Buell. The character was then adapted by writer/artist John Stanley and artist Irving Tripp for Dell's "Four Color Comics" and eventually an eponymous title.

The stories are presented chronologically and center on Lulu Moppet and her neighbor Tubby Tompkins, who is alternately her best friend and chief rival. The charming, often hilarious content is appropriate for all ages. The cast of intelligent and inventive children seems like a direct predecessor of Charles Schultz's classic "Peanuts" comic strip and would probably appeal to fans of that series.² of 2 people found the following review helpful.
