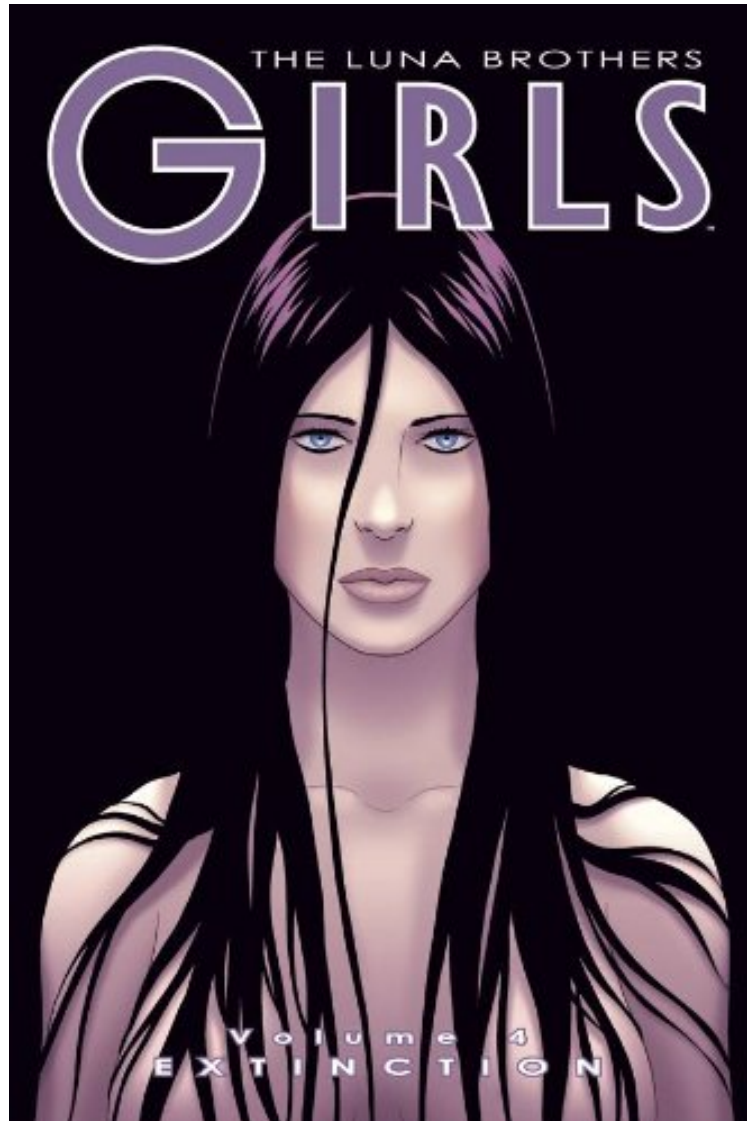

The sense of frenzy had been building up to this point, with mob rule taking increasingly brutal measures against suspect members of the community. The mob has fragmented, so everyone's suspect, and the brutality reaches startling levels. This paints a depressingly accurate picture of how so many people

respond to an enemy they can't defeat: they turn on each other. This does come to an end, though. The Girls are exterminated completely, so whatever their threat might have been, it's gone. What happens next would be a spoiler, so I leave it to you to find out for yourself. Although it does offer some kind of closure, this ending doesn't wholly block the way to sequels. One big thing did not get resolved, though. After what the small sleepy town had been through, the violence of neighbor against neighbor and friend against friend, deep psychic wounds remain. The survivors have a lot to live with, in themselves and in the people they thought they knew. That lasting, perhaps permanent damage is never mentioned, let alone explored. Still, it's a rewarding story. I can't give the art highest marks - blank expressions and stiff poses don't carry the visual side of the story as well as one could hope - but, on the whole, well worth reading. --wiredweird0 of 0 people found the following review helpful. So halfway through reading the book, the spine fell off, leaving me with just the pages all glued together, barely, and slowly separating as well. The 4th book I got was as good as the 1st book at face value. The spine glue was thick and visible, the book didn't seem to present any problems till about half way through. I found a huge rip in the pages, only one page, but it cut through almost all the dialog on both paths, distorted the images of the characters and just felt like a bit of a downer to lose so much build in the story over this issue with how the book was probably handled.
