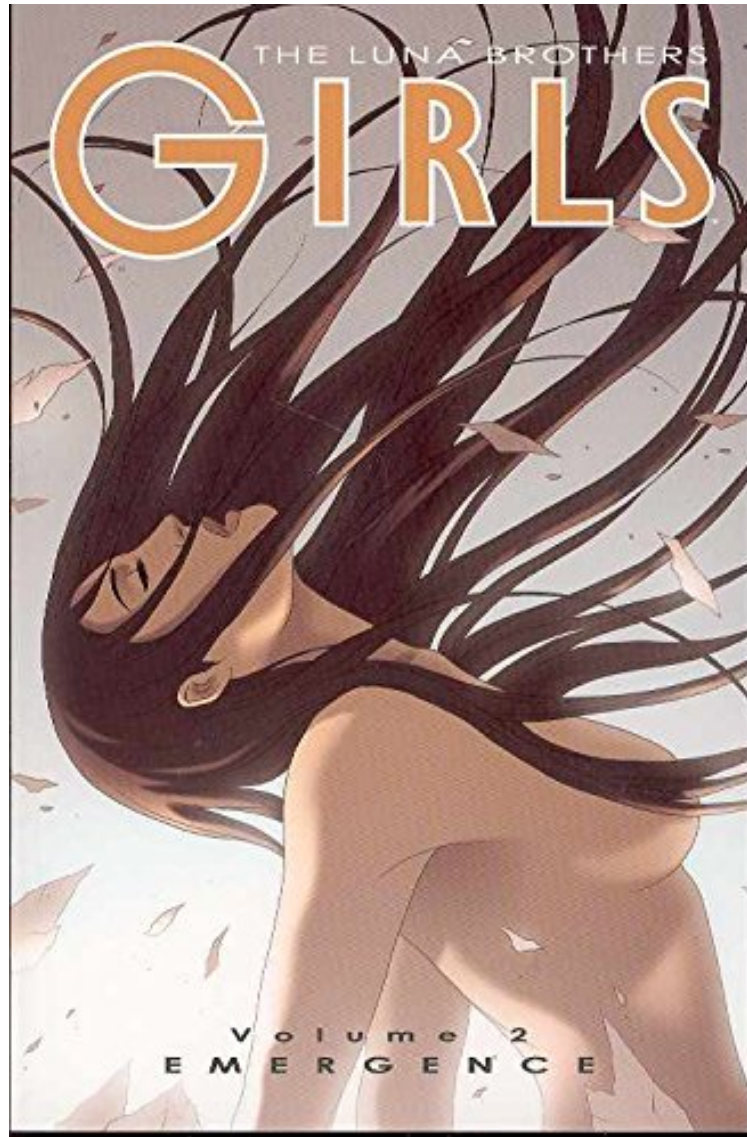

However; when I got the books, books 2 and 3's spine glue was weak or nonexistent. So halfway through reading the book, the spine fell off, leaving me with just the pages all glued together, barely, and slowly separating as well. The 4th book I got was as good as the 1st book at face value. The spine glue was

thick and visible, the book didn't seem to present any problems till about half way through. I found a huge rip in the pages, only one page, but it cut through almost all the dialog on both paths, distorted the images of the characters and just felt like a bit of a downer to lose so much build in the story over this issue with how the book was probably handled.
