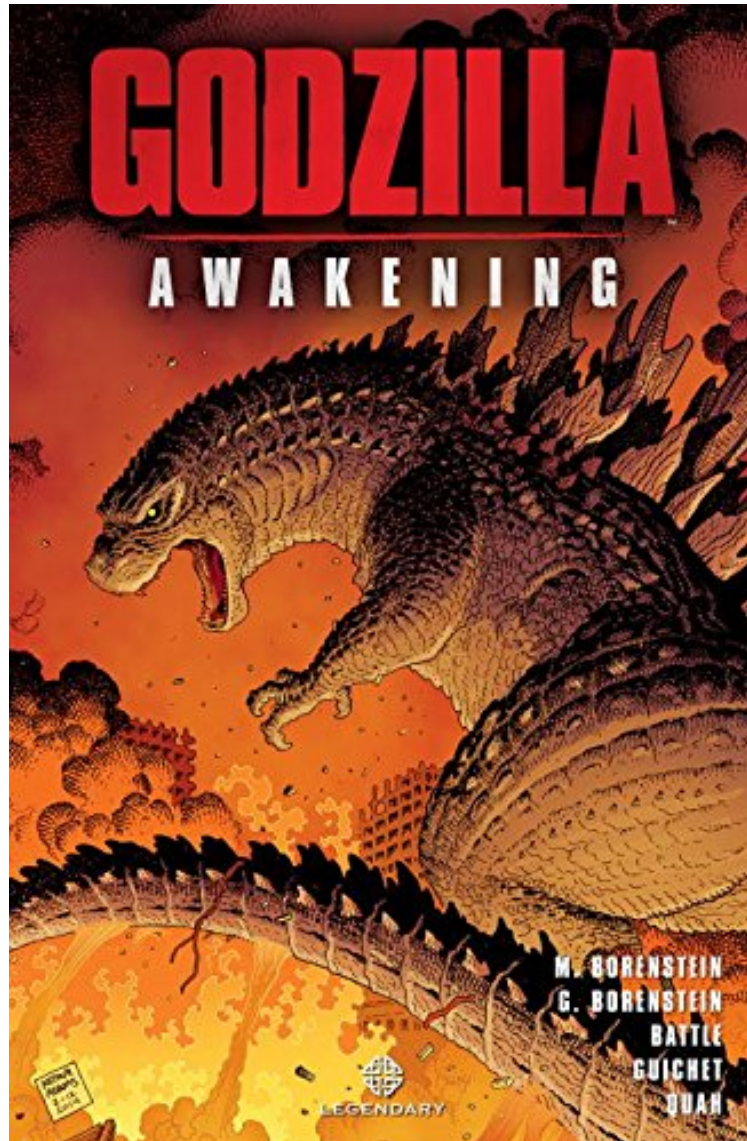

After recently watching Godzilla Tokyo SOS (great film for Godzilla fans), I decided to purchase this. As most other people have stated this comic is really short, and I'm glad I didn't pay \$20.00

for it. The only reason I am giving this four stars is because I am a Godzilla fan, plus I found the art drawn well; it looks great even on my ancient Kindle. For everyone else who liked the movie and wants more, I can only give this a solid three. The purpose of this comic is to give background on the Monarch organization (and in particular, history on one of the minor characters in the movie) and M.U.T.O. For the most part it does the job well. After the end of the comic there are some pages with concept art that are pretty good. Now as for the Kindle edition, you get the option to look at each panel (panel) one at a time or look at a whole page. This option is a bit jarring as it will repeat one panel pages (like when there is a large graphic of Godzilla or the MUTO). However, the panel option is useful if you are reading on the smaller Kindles (like I am). See the video for an example of how the panel option works. Also, I'm not sure if this is in color as I don't own a Kindle Fire. Overall, if you are a Godzilla fan and liked the movie, this will be a great purchase, as it does have more Godzilla than the movie version. If you liked the movie but not enthused by it you may want to hold off on buying this until it is cheaper.

As much as I have gone through browsing the illustrations, you won't get to see Godzilla all the time in this book but of course he is still in the book. This concentrates on the events some 40 - 50 years before the events in the movie occurred so don't expect to see Bryan Cranston or Elizabeth Olsen in illustrated form. The last few pages are dedicated to the conception of the art found in this graphic novel. The cover itself, I can probably spend a good amount of time looking at it. I recommend this to any Godzilla memorabilia collectors.

By LATO Overall I enjoyed **Godzilla: Awakening**, The artwork is well done, and the story ties together quite nicely to further flesh out the history leading up to the 2014 **Godzilla** movie. That said, I felt as though the story was sometimes a bit rushed, perhaps even perfunctory. It covers a lot of time in its brief page count and doesn't really delve into some very interesting concepts and some potentially memorable characters. Were the review process a little broader, I would probably have rated this at 3.5 stars, but rounded up instead of down. I'd hope that any future graphic novels supporting the **Godzilla 2014** series might be more in-depth, even if the page count and the cost are higher as a result. In short, I'd recommend **Godzilla: Awakening** to fans of the most recent movie, although I'd have bumped this review up to 5 stars if there'd been more to it!
