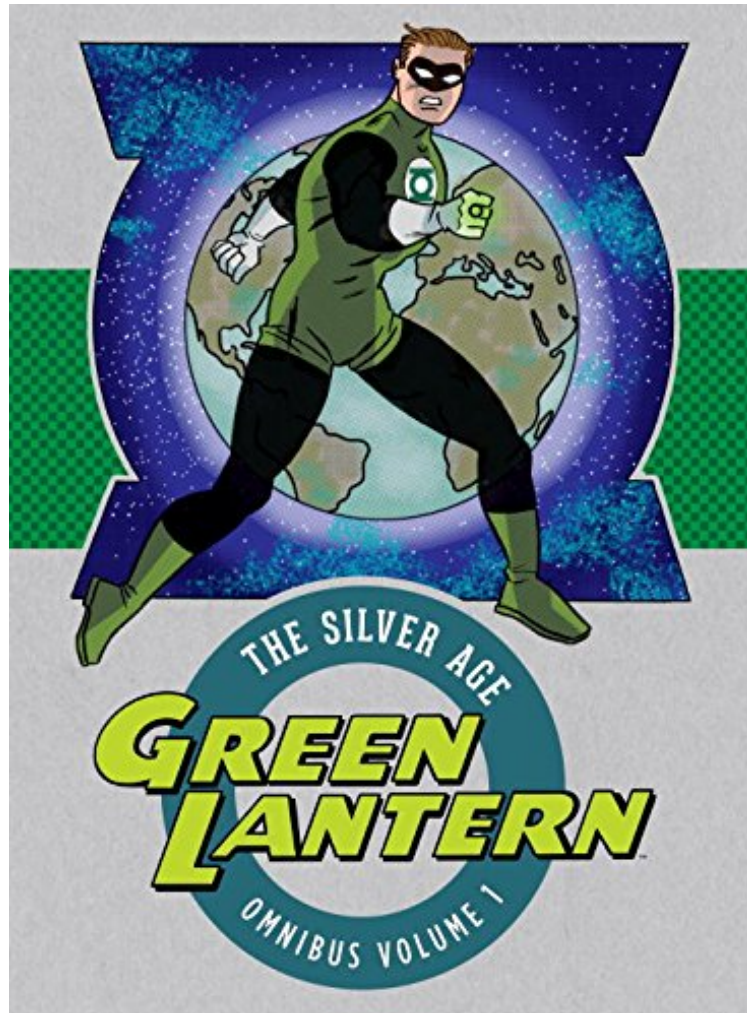

Many of the stories are now considered classics and the artwork is first rate for the Silver Age - keep in mind that Silver Age comics were written and drawn for kids. Included here are the introduction of the new Green Lantern in Showcase issues 22 through 24, and the first 35 issues of the Silver Age Green Lantern comic. These comics laid the foundations

of part of the DC universe and will jog the memory of many baby boomers. If you are a Green Lantern or Silver Age comics fan you should enjoy this collection. What I do not understand is why DC decided to "reboot" the Green Lantern Omnibus series? DC had already published two volumes of Green Lantern Omnibuses without "Silver Age" in the title.
