Fresh off the recent crossover heavy story arch (previously involving Relic) that have long been a mainstay of the series (even during Johns' writing), the lanterns have run into another universal threat. It has been exposed to the Corp that their rings now absorb energy from the very finite

reservoir of emotional energy for the universe. This turn of events causes a major schism for the Corps and Hal to have to come to terms with, it also allows the opportunity for an unrecognizable threat to appear for the new leader of the Corps in the Durlans. A shape shifting race that is unable to be completely warred against. In my opinion, the Durlans species has been a great turn for the series itself. They provide an interesting species (with slightly Lovecraftian overtones in their appearance) and they are an enemy that actually causes Hal to consider the actions of his people and how to manage a force that could be anywhere and anyone. I felt like this was a fresh turn of events for the GL series. Vendetti is truly coming into his own after Johns famous 9 year run. This is still a major crossover event between the main GL book and the GL Corps vol 5. Uprising story arc and are mostly provided during your read, but for better back story I suggest reading them together lest a small amount of confusion over a few characters that are more involved in the opposite volume. By VPMI find myself as usual, enjoying being immersed in the Green Lantern universe, though I can see why some fans were less than thrilled with the moral ambiguity and changes the arc carried over from the last book. However physically, this book, which I got as a new condition hardback, has several clusters of pages that are poorly printed, being pale and in some cases streaky. Otherwise, the book seems nicely made, it's well bound and looks nice from the outside (with or without dust jacket).
