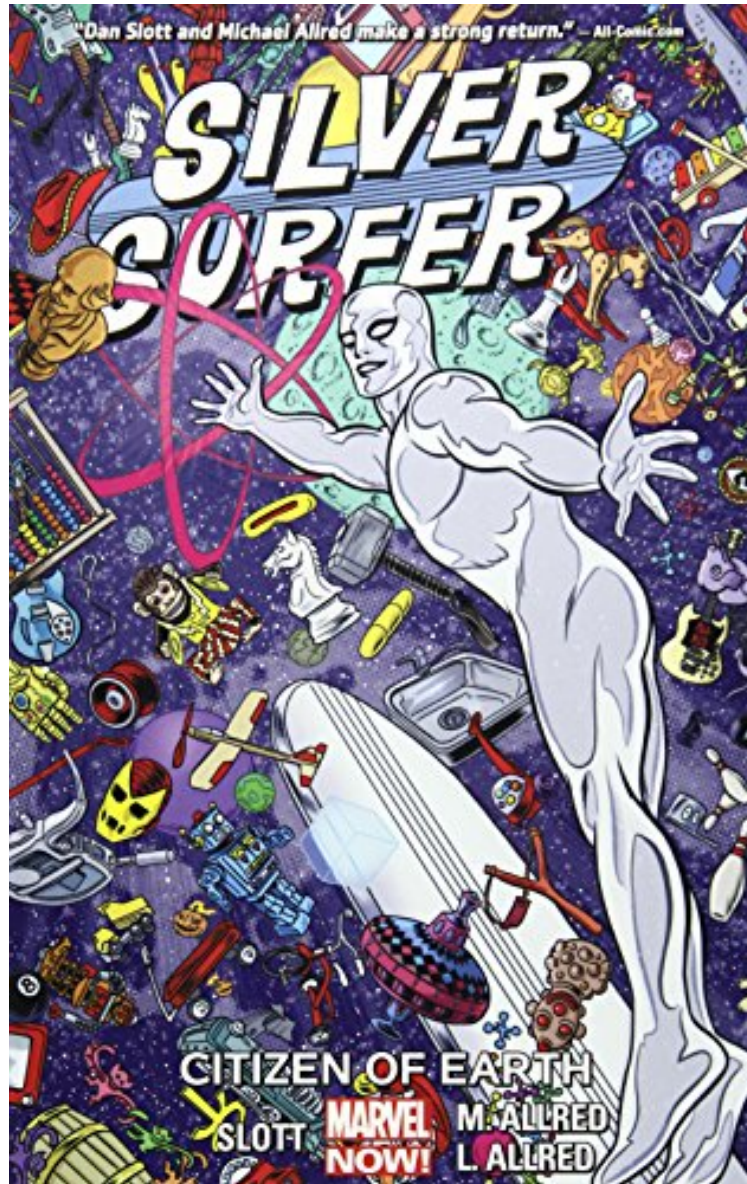

It is still very funny and heartwarming, but there wasn't something a little off about this volume. **BELOW ARE MY SPOILER-FILLED REVIEWS OF EACH ISSUE IN THIS COLLECTION:** Issue #1: This is basically a fun, one-and-done story that has a slight lead-in to the next issue. An alien species is stealing all of Earth's culture, and they are able to bring famous fictitious protagonists to life! I'm starting to realize that, like Sherlock Holmes, Surfer can sometimes be an arrogant jerk (but in a funny way). This issue has the first appearance of the Keeper, and The Thing makes a brief cameo. (3.5 stars) Issue #2: This issue sheds some light on Zenn-La culture, and reveals some parts of Norrins' past to Dawn. In a flashback sequence we meet Norrins' betrothed, Shalla-Bal. In present day, she attacks Earth as the Keeper, the spiritual leader of the displaced Zenn-La people. The Thing is entranced as her herald, acting against his usual nature. Alicia Masters is also in this issue. (3.5 stars) Issue #3: Alicia and Dawn are the only ones on Earth immune from the power of a Zenn-La machine that is converting everyone and everything to become Zenn-Lavians. The Thing wills himself out of his trance, and now he, Surfer, and the two women are the only ones that stand against the Keeper and her minions. Even the Avengers show up and get converted to Zenn-Lavians, so things aren't looking good. Surfer knows that sacrificing himself by using his life force on the machine will save everyone, so he does it and dies. This issue marks the 50th anniversary for the Silver Surfer (3.5 stars) Issue #4: The confrontation with the Zenn-Lavians comes to an end, and tons of the Marvel Universe superheroes join in the fight in this issue. Surfer is heralded as a great savior of Earth, and the nations all honor him. (3.5 stars) Issue #5: The storyline moves on, and (two years behind the rest of the Marvel Universe) the Silver Surfer is feeling the effects of the 2014 event, Original Sin. Looking for Uatu on the Moon, Surfer learns from The Unseen (formerly Nick Fury) that he is dead. The two have an interesting conversation, which ultimately leads Surfer back to his life with Dawn. Trying to give a gift to Dawn, Surfer tracks down her mother (a woman that abandoned her family when Dawn was still a child). It was fun seeing The Unseen in this collection. As far as I am aware, this is one of his only appearances since Original Sin. (4 stars) Issue #6: This was a fun issue which also celebrates the Silver Surfer's 200th comic book. Spider-Man is the guest star (which is fun because Dan Slott is currently writing both this book and The Amazing Spider-Man). This book concludes the Dawn's Mom story, while also showing us an adventure with Spider-Man, and the end of the book opens things up for wherever the creative team wants to go next. There was an allusion to the notorious "Spider-Man" stories, "Brand New Day" and "One More Day" in this issue. (4.5 stars) 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
