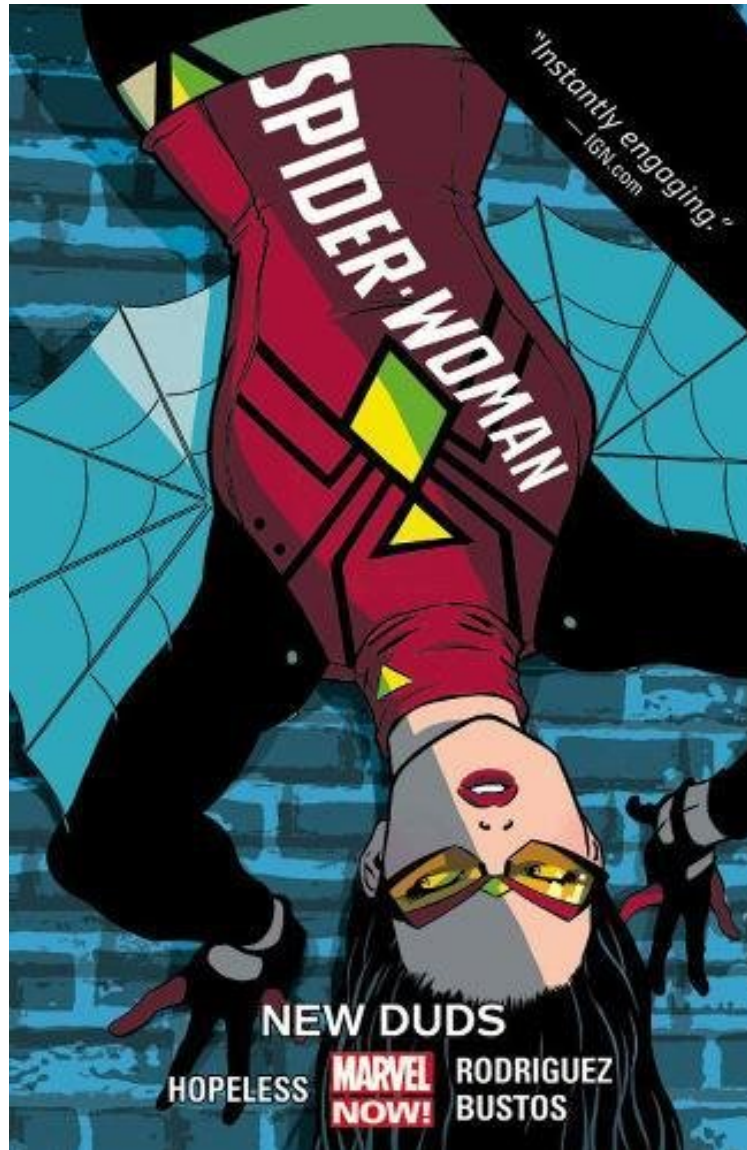

I picked up Spider Woman (2014-15) 1-4 before reading this collection, which covers 5-10.Spoiler alert!!! - or time saving info: at the end of Spider Woman 4, Jess quits (takes a leave of absence from) the Avengers. That is all you really need to know

from the earlier issues to follow the story in New Duds. The rest of the issues involve the Spider-verse story arc, spanning a number of titles I don't read, and while the Spider Woman story line can be read on its own, it feels incomplete. Maybe I would pick up a volume with the entire saga in order, but if you're just interested in a Spider Woman story, THIS is a great place to start. If you're reading this, you've probably read a basic description of the story, and I won't give any more spoilers - I'll just tell you what you really want to know: It works. The PI line had me thinking it might be more like Alias, but it's nowhere near that gritty. The best comparison I can make is Matt Fraction's work on recreating Hawkeye as a solo character - if you enjoyed that, this should be right up your alley (and if you haven't read that, it's a good next stop if you end up liking this). Even though this is supposed to be Jessica Drew as everyday person, the story is still very much superhero - just with Spider Woman taking on "D-listers" (as Black Widow points out at the end, as Spider Woman is re-drafted by the Avengers to spin into the New Secret Wars), instead of the major villains threatening to destroy the world who the Avengers take on regularly. Having recently read Like Cage's original run, I especially loved seeing Seor Suerte again - bad villains never die, I guess, they just wait to resurface at a time when their mediocrity can be part of the story.
