Considering there's minimal Joss Whedon involvement, this volume captures the essence of Spike. The cover art is beautiful, as is the artwork inside, and the book has quality binding. This volume covers what happened to Spike and Illyria following the series finale of Angel and before the events of Angel: After the Fall. Story wise, it's a lot like Angel: After the Fall: it's very intense in comparison with the actual TV series, but I like it. They are able to go places they would not be able to go in syndicated low-budget television show... Like Hell, for example. If you're a Spike fan, and are comfortable with comic books as a medium, this is a great buy.
