Dean Foster's novel *Splinter of the Mind's Eye* in 1979 as a ten year-old who was eagerly waiting the (then) super-secret sequel to *Star Wars*. It did NOT disappoint. Years later, I discovered that not only was it based on an idea from an early draft of *Star Wars - Episode IV: A New Hope*, but that it was also intended as a possible low-budget sequel to *Episode IV* if that film's box-office receipts turned out to be less than stellar. Well, if you've ever read the novel and wished that it had been brought to the screen (hello, Dave Filoni?), this graphic novel is a good second. The artwork is incredible---Luke Skywalker looks like Mark Hamill, Leia looks like Carrie Fisher, and the ships and weapons appear as they did in the movies. Due to his unique helmet and mask, Darth Vader is an incredibly difficult character to draw with movie-quality authenticity---and yet they did it! They even managed to fix a minor story continuity issue between the book and the movies by including Vader's personal Super Star Destroyer, the *Executor*, as well as Captain Pielt, the harried officer promoted to admiral near the start of *Episode V: The Empire Strikes Back*. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
