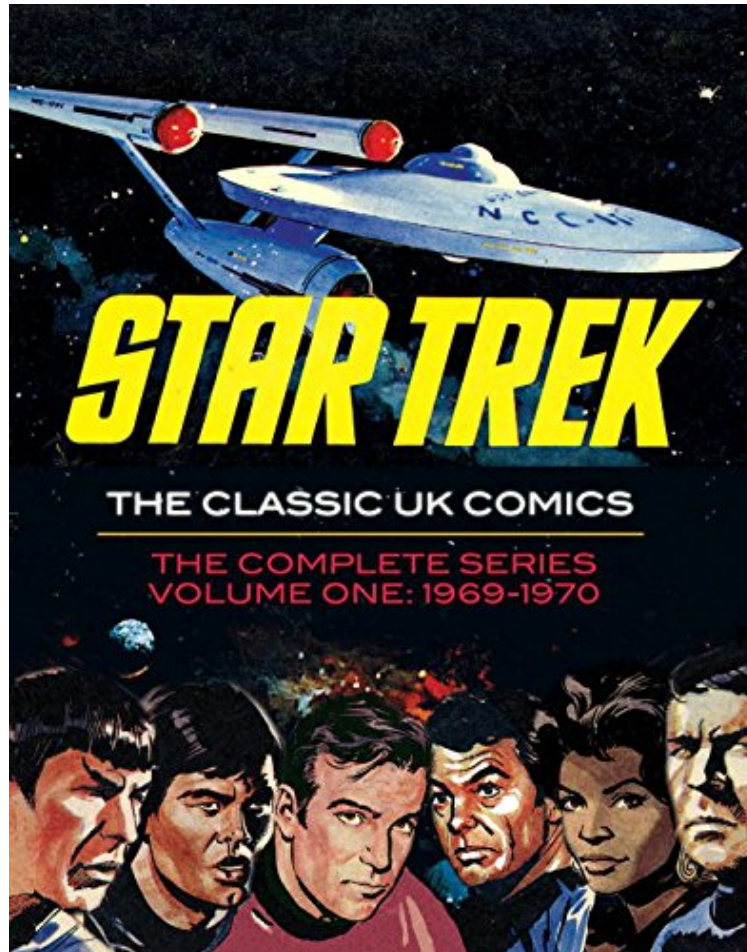

I have included some photos and I hope will let me post them.Granted this was going to be a problem because the half of the strips are pulled from the Joe 90 Tabloid Size Magazine that featured all connected two pages layouts. It makes sense that these may have all come from the centerfoldBut the main problem is Word Balloons are almost always split over the two pages. While I don't like the loss of art , the loss of word balloons is totally

unacceptable. This Book was on the top of my reading list, when it arrived I ditched the shrink wrap and dug in. After a frustrating 40 pages I reluctantly gave up. I was spending so much time with these obscured panels that it was taking all the fun out of my reading experience. On Page 130 we go to some black and white strips and then back to a now three page episodes. For all of these there is no problem since none of these strips use the double page spreads. In 1969, six months before the Star Trek TV series premiered in England, British comics readers were introduced to the characters in an original comic book series. The stories were serialized, generally 2 to 3 pages at a time, in 257 weekly magazines spanning five years and 37 storylines. These extremely rare comics have never been published in the United States. Star Trek fans will quickly note that the comics were not written with strict adherence to Star Trek's core concepts. The Enterprise frequently traveled outside our galaxy, and the crew committed many violations of the never-mentioned Prime Directive along the way. Spock shouted most of his lines and often urged Kirk (or "Kurt," as his name was misspelled in early issues) to shoot first and ask questions later. But it's precisely that "offness" that makes them so eminently readable and deserving of a proper reprinting. They're unique in the annals of Star Trek and fans have gone without them for far too long.
