The events of the two reboot movies are directly referenced in this set of stories and as such should be viewed to get the most out of this comic book.In this set

of stories the crew of the Enterprise is making preparations to depart on their five year exploration mission when they receive a distress call from a Klingon colony which has come under attack by Romulans. The core of the story is a conspiracy by Section 31 to topple the threat of the Klingon Empire once and for all, with Kirk trying desperately to avert an all out war. The story itself steers the new Trek continuity into new territory as it shows the impact the reboot movies have had on galaxy. With the Federation, Klingons, and Romulan's busting out loads of new technologies that they hadn't come up with in the original timeline. It makes sense that after Nero's ship the Narada appeared it would cause a new technology arms race, but some of the new changes seem odd, such as the Romulan's failing to develop the cloaking devices that they are known for. For the most part the art is very nice, even going as far as to include the lens flare that the rebooted movies were infamous for. The characters all look interesting and nice, but the ships (especially the new ones) feel a bit bland in comparison. Overall this book works as a stand alone follow up to the movies.
